Friday 26th February 2021 - Spicy LO: To sketch, and improve upon sketches, in the style of the early drawings of Gustav Klimt.

Sketch like Gustav Klimt!

On the paper below, sketch a portrait of a person in your house (who doesn't mind sitting for you!) or a picture of a person.

Draw in pencil and sketch quickly – try to get a basic outline in less than five minutes: Focus on getting the face right first, just like Klimt did.

Sketch in other details with light pencil marks.

Top Tips

- 1. Be gentle! Use light strokes as you draw. You can always go over light pencil strokes when you are happy with them.
- 2. Don't worry about making mistakes! It's only pencil you can rub out, or go over any marks you aren't happy with.
- 3. Remember, Klimt's sketches 'tell a story' by making you think about what the person is thinking, feeling or doing. You can tell a story by making the face and hands of your sketch more detailed than the rest of the body or background.

Shading

- When your outline sketch is completed, add detail by shading. Look at the shading in Klimt's sketches; how do you think he achieved these effects?
- Practise making marks and shading with pencils on scrap paper or around your sketch. When you're ready, try shading your sketch.
