# **Citizenship at Waterside**

The aim of our citizenship program is for all pupils to leave Waterside Primary School with a sense of belonging to a tightly knit community. They will have confidence, aspirations, understand their choices in life and the difference they can make as a global citizen.

### How does it work?

- Each pupil has a Citizenship Passport with 10 activities to be completed throughout the year. These will be posted on Dojo for you to refer to.
- Each activity is linked to a Waterside value and there is one activity to complete for each one.
- There are 3 additional activities to be completed at home or at school.
- If activities are completed at home, children will be asked to bring in a photograph or send one via Dojo for school to print off and these will be placed in the Citizenship book.
- At the end of the year upon completion, pupils will receive a Citizenship certificate and award for their year group
