It has been another fantastic week in our Early Years Foundation Stage and yet again I have been amazed by the learning taking place by all of our children.

This half term the Nursery children's topic has been about Bears, last week the children went on an adventure on the school mini buses to Hanley Park to have a teddy bears picnic. The children were so inquisitive asking lots of questions about the environment and were impeccably behaved, we are so proud of them all! This week they have been reading the story 'We're going on a bear hunt' and have been busy building using different resources.

The children have used a variety of 2D and 3D shapes to build solid structures and have been using new mathematic vocabulary to talk about the shapes properties. In the construction area they have been making bridges to get over the river from the story and have been working collaboratively to test different bridges which they have made to see which is the strongest.

Reception are currently learning all about contrasting places so they are currently comparing where we live to colder places such as The Arctic and Antarctica. The children can now talk about different animals which live in these areas of the world and can talk about how they adapt to their surroundings.

I have also been so impressed with the art which the children have produced this week, they have been developing their line work and have created fantastic masterpieces of a polar bear. The children are also now demonstrating the knowledge and skills they have learnt during direct teaching and adult led activities in their own independent play which is amazing to see.



In Computing, it is great to see how well everyone has adapted to their Computing Curriculum and how they are growing increasingly confident with using their iPads across not only their computing lessons but across other areas of the curriculum.

In Y6 the children have done great work with using technology in their topic of spreadsheets and even using their knowledge from earlier in the year of Computing Fundamentals to create and present presentations to their class. Children also benefited in Y5 from their earlier work as they have thoroughly enjoyed editing images and texts within Microsoft Word linking to their Writing text 'The Wizard of Oz'. In Y2 they have also been working hard with their Spreadsheet work and learning how to colour cells and add text. REPORTING AN ABSENCE



CONTACT BEFORE 9AM

If your child is not in school by 9am and we haven't heard from you, we begin to worry about your child's safety and implement safeguarding procedures.



STAY IN TOUCH BY PHONE OR EMAIL

You can get in touch by email, phone call or voicemail and all messages will be picked up by our attendance team.



CONTACT EVERY DAY

Even if you have told us you don't expect your child to attend on a future day, we need contact on each day of absence to confirm this. Without this, absences will be unauthorised.



SEEK MEDICAL ADVICE IF NECCESARY

We can only approve a certain number of absences without a letter from a doctor, dentist, councillor or other professional.



GIVE DETAILED

Absences reported without any details will not be authorised. This includes not getting in touch and not giving a thorough reason for absence.
