are now holding their pencil in a tripod grip. I cannot wait to see what learning they do next week! Mrs Morray- Early Years Foundation Stage Lead





REPORTING AN ABSENCE



CONTACT BEFORE 9AM

If your child is not in school by 9am and we haven't heard from you, we begin to worry about your child's safety and implement safeguarding procedures.



STAY IN TOUCH BY PHONE OR EMAIL

You can get in touch by email, phone call or voicemail and all messages will be picked up by our attendance team.



CONTACT EVERY DAY

Even if you have told us you don't expect your child to attend on a future day, we need contact on each day of absence to confirm this. Without this, absences will be unauthorised.



SEEK MEDICAL ADVICE IF NECCESARY

We can only approve a certain number of absences without a letter from a doctor, dentist, councillor or other professional.



GIVE DETAILED REASONING

Absences reported without any details will not be authorised. This includes not getting in touch and not giving a thorough reason for absence.

Help with Learning If you require any support with learning, please contact your child's class teacher via class dojo. Help with Behaviour If you are concerned about your child's behaviour, please speak with the class teacher or your child's Phase leader.
