It has been a long half term, and I know that the children are ready for a break to rest and come back ready for Autumn 2.

This half term we have introduced TT rock stars and numbots, we have started our new forest school program, developed our new school parliament, ran our enrichment clubs, had our outdoor area revamped, conducted a film night and much more.

It has been a busy half term of learning and it has been great to watch the children continue to develop over the past 8 weeks. I have seen them grow in confidence. One of our focuses has been around developing language and communication. We encourage all children to speak in full sentences at all times. Children are increasingly able to talk about their learning and are developing their language skills to develop conversations. It always makes my day when a child asks 'How has you day been?' and in return they can tell me about theirs.

Reading is always a priority at Waterside as it is an essential skill that all children should have to help them in every aspect of life. This half term, we have continued to develop their love for reading with our book club session where children have the opportunity to share what they have read, and make recommendations. Thank you for your support with reading at home – every little bit of reading helps.

Next half term, we will be focusing on social and emotional learning, and using a technique called Red to Blue to help support children in developing emotional resilience and how to self manage their emotions. Thank you for responding to our questionnaire around workshops in school. Emotional support for children was one of the top requests, so we will be keen to invite parents into school so that we can share our strategies with you.

Alongside our school Parliament, we want to support pupils in being global citizens. To do this, we will be introducing our citizenship program with children where they can earn badges over their time at primary school for make positive contributions.


Next half term will be just as busy as we head towards our assessment week where we will conduct our in school assessments.
