Curriculum Overview for Autumn Term 2 – Year 3

English

This half term we are using the text 'Peter Pan' to support our writing.

We will be writing a character description; a first person re-tell and a non-chronological report.

- Use conjunctions, adverbs, and prepositions to express time, -place and causes (e.g., when, before, after, while, so because then, next, soon, therefore, during, in, because of).
- Not down new ideas, key words and topic specific vocabulary in a given planning format with some appropriate detail Extend as a matter of course, the range of sentences with more than one clause by using a wider range of conjunctions including: when, if, because and although
- Begin to use paragraphs independently to group related materials.
- Use headings, sub headings and labelled diagrams to structure text and aid presentation.
- Evaluate their own and others writing, suggesting improvements to grammar and vocabulary.



We will continue with addition and subtraction and begin to look at multiplication and division.

- Add and subtract numbers with up to 3 digits, using formal written methods of columnar addition and subtraction.
- Estimate the answer to a calculation and use inverse operations to check answers
- Solve problems, including missing number problems, using number facts, place value, and more complex addition and subtraction
- Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4, and 8 multiplication tables.
- Write and calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division using multiplication tables that they know, including for two-digit numbers times one-digit numbers, using mental and progressing to formal written methods.

Science

Our Science topic this half term is 'Animals and Including Humans.'

Identify that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition, and that they cannot make their own food; they get nutrition from what they eat.

History

Our History topic for this half term is, 'Indus Valley.'

Pupils will understand the achievements of the earliest civilizations – an overview of where and when the first civilizations appeared and a depth study of one of the following: Ancient Sumer; The Indus Valley; Ancient Egypt; The Shang Dynasty of Ancient China.
