Dear Parents and Carers

As you will already be aware, there is a **Red** weather warning that has been issued for Stoke on Trent on Monday and Tuesday. We will do everything we can at school to ensure that your children stay cool and safe. Please ensure that your child has their **sunhat, water bottle and that**



you have applied sunscreen before they have arrived at school.

In school we will ensure that:

- Children have access to drinking water at all times and will be actively encouraged to drink and fill up their water bottles regularly throughout the day
- There will be no vigorous activity either during lessons or at break/lunch times
- Shaded areas around the school will be maximized
- Teaching teams will keep classrooms as cool as possible by having blinds down, using paper flipcharts and non-electrical equipment to deliver lessons in the classrooms, lights off, large fans where needed, ventilation and will utilize the coolest areas around the school. Curriculum & timetable adjustments will also be made where necessary
- We will monitor your children carefully and if your child does not manage with these adjustments in place we will inform you immediately.

Children are still required to wear basic school uniform. **Ties, jumpers and blazers will not be required for these two days. Sandals will be permitted** (no heels or flipflops please as these create avoidable healthy and safety risks).



For health and safety reasons, we have also taken the decision to **postpone the open afternoon until September for all year groups except Year 6**; as extra people in the classrooms will increase the heat/temperature levels. We will organise an alternative event very early on in the new year for EYFS, Years 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5.
