Birth to 2years

Pass things from one hand to the other. Let go of things and hand them to another person, or drop them.

2-year-olds	Au. 1	Build independently with a range of appropriate resources.

3-year-olds	Au. 1	Shows can use a one-handed tool. Begin Dough Disco
	Au. 2	Makes snips in paper using scissors. Begin Squiggle Wiggle
	Sp. 1	Child shows a preference for a dominant hand.
	Sp. 2	Begin to hold a pencil with a modified tripod grip to show control. Begin name writing if ready
	Su. 1	Demonstrate a growing independence putting on a coat and shoes, begin to do zips.
	Su. 2	Begin to use a knife and fork.

4-year-olds	Au. 1	Children using pencils and other equipment comfortably for them. Children making snips in paper either using one hand or two.
	Au. 2	Children continuing to develop their fine motor skills. Children beginning to learn correct letter formations and use these in their writing.
	Sp. 1	Developing an effective pencil grip. Developing skill when using tools including scissors.
	Sp. 2	Children forming recognisable letters with an effective pencil grip.
	Su. 1	Confidently using scissors and small tools. Beginning to use a tripod grip to draw and write accurately.
	Su. 2	Children using the tripod grip. Using a range of small tools. Showing accuracy when drawing.

- Hold a pencil effectively in preparation for fluent writing using the tripod grip in almost all cases.
- Use a range of small tools, including scissors, paintbrushes and cutlery.
- Begin to show accuracy and care when drawing.
