The Crimean War was fought between 1853 and 1856. It was fought in the Crimea, an area in the south of Russia at the time (now part of Ukraine). On one side were Britain, France, and Turkey, and on the other side was Russia.

Florence Nightingale was named 'The lady with the lamp' because she carried lamp with her as she walked around the hospital where she worked.

Hospitals improved their conditions because of the work of Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole.

Both Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole have written books.

## Key people

Florence Nightingale	Florence Nightingale was the founder of modern nursing. She came to prominence while serving as a manager and trainer of nurses during the Crimean War, in which she organised care for wounded soldiers at Constantinople. 
Mary Jane Seacole	Mary Jane Seacole was a British-Jamaican nurse, healer and businesswoman who set up the "British Hotel" behind the lines during the Crimean War.
