


Monarch	A leader of a country, e.g a King or a Queen.	 	<input type="checkbox"/> There were six Tudor monarchs who ruled England from 1485-1603 <input type="checkbox"/> Religion was very important in Tudor times. Everyone had to go to church. If you didn't attend the same church as the monarch, you might get arrested, thrown into the Tower of London, or even executed. <input type="checkbox"/> Henry VIII had six wives. <input type="checkbox"/> Henry VII created the Church of England so he could divorce his first wife.
Medieval	The Middle Ages – the period of history from 500 AD to 1500 AD.		
Legacy	Anything handed down from the past.		
Reformation	The act of changing (reforming) something. In this case, the reformation of the church to remove the Pope's control.

The walls were then painted white.
Heir	The person next in line to throne who will take over when the current King or Queen dies.		
Rebellion	Violent action organised by a group of people who are trying to change something.		
Parliament	Where politicians meet to decide laws and make decisions.		
Military	The armed forces of a country.		
Devout	Deeply religious and devoted their beliefs.
