The first Poppy Day took place 3 years after the end of WWI on 11.11.1919.

The Royal British Legion founder – Earl Haig was persuaded to adopt the poppy as an emblem for the Legion in the UK

The first 'Poppy Appeal' in the UK organised by the Royal British Legion raised over £106,000. Money raised helped ex-soldiers with housing and jobs.

> The poppy was chosen to remember those who died in battle as these were the flowers that grew on the battlefields after WWI ended. 'In Flanders Fields' by John

McCrae is a famous poem which describes these fields of poppies and war.

The poppy factory in England is in Richmond, London.

Nowadays, the money raised from the 'Poppy Appeal' is used to help servicemen and women who are still alive, whose lives have been changed in wars that they have fought in plus those who've lost loved ones because of wars. The poppy is a symbol to remember those who have lost their lives in conflicts around the world.
