Important facts

WW2 was a battle between 12 groups of countries. Allied powers (Britain, France, Russia & US) and Axis powers (Germany, Italy & Japan).

Hitler wanted Germany to rule Europe. To gain land and power, Germany invaded Poland.

The bombing of London (the Blitz) lasted for 57 nights. Hitled wanted to crush the British spirit so we would surrender.

A plane machine gunned all the way down Freeman Street and over People's Park. There were several civilian casualties, one of them being Eric Chapman

Both the allies and axis powers used propaganda posters to boost morale of people at home and those fighting. Grimsby was replaced in newspapers as 'an East Coast Town.'

37 bombing raids on Grimsby claimed 196 lives. Convamore Road, Heneage Road, Lord street and Farebrother street all bombed. .

TRAWLER Scrimsby used as a marker by the Nazis for bombing raids due to the Dock Tower.
