Year 1 Poetry

EYFS/KS1 Key objectives:

To listen, and respond to, a range of poetry around a theme.

To look at rhyme within poems.

To collect words that rhyme.

Recognise and join in with repeated phrases and words

In Year 1, children should be taught to read, write and perform the following types of poetry:

• Acrostics; • Shape Poems/Calligrams; • Riddles
