Uniform Reminders

We are proud of the way the vast majority of our students wear their uniform and attend school looking smart and ready to learn. Further areas for improvement in 2022-2023 relate to skirt length, knee length socks, dark coats and the chosen shoe. Your support to meet the expectations is greatly appreciated.

Monkhouse is our primary uniform supplier of school uniform. However, we can confirm that local retailer, Impressions in Leyland, will also be able to supply uniform products to you.

The summer holiday is often a time when students get their ears pierced or dye their hair in a colour that may not be deemed appropriate for school. We would like to remind all parents and students that piercings or extreme hair styles will not be allowed in September so please carefully consider this if/when your son/ daughter is thinking of either of those.

Please also remember that we will strictly enforce the rules regarding skirt length from September (the skirt length must reach the top of the knee cap) and that all shoes must be sturdy, black ones. As outlined in our recent Tweak of the Week focus, we really do not want parents to spend hard earned money on shoes or a skirt that does not meet our expectations meaning we have to contact you early in September. If unsure, please just contact us and, as we have said previously, reach out to us if we can help in any way.

We would also like to remind parents and students of the expectations with regards to our PE kit. Last year's transitional stage between the old and new PE kit should now come to an end and we expect to see all students in full PE kit in September.

With regards to school shoes, as a reminder, these should be black, leather like and sturdy. Shoes should be traditional and look like school shoes - ballet style pumps that slip on, trainers and those that are nearly, but not quite trainers (some kickers styles) are not suitable.
