PSHCE Day 4- 22nd March Year 10

On Wednesday 22nd March, we will be holding our fourth Personal, Social, Health and Careers' Education (PSHCE) drop-down day of the academic year, which will be an important opportunity to cover some essential topics in the areas of relationships, health and living in the wider world.

On this day there will be a Careers fair that all students in school will have a chance to attend for a one-hour slot. There will be over 35 companies in attendance and this is an amazing opportunity to encounter employers from the local area and see the wide range of exciting opportunities available to students post 16 and to raise aspirations. A program outlining the companies in attendance has been published on ClassCharts by Mr West.

As your son/daughter is in **Year 10** below is an outline of the sessions they will experience in addition to the careers fair. It should be noted that the Key Stage 4 curriculum builds further from Key Stage 3 so some topics students will have encountered before, however, will now build upon this to a more age appropriate depth.

First Aid

Knowing how to perform basic emergency first aid, how to give CPR according to St John's Ambulance in order to sustain life whilst waiting for emergency services.

Gambling

Knowing where to go to find support in the event they (or others) were to be involved with gambling addiction or issues. Knowing how to recognise financial exploitation including online. Health Services

Knowing how to access health services relevant to age now and in future life. Knowing why and how people donate blood, stem cells and organs and the importance of this in our society. Knowing how to live healthily to avoid or reduce risk of cancers and how to check their body for cancers.

To identify, manage and seek help for unhealthy behaviours, habits and addictions. Knowing strategies for identifying risky and emergency situations, including online; ways to manage these and get appropriate help, including where there may be legal consequences.

Lessons delivered are always age appropriate and information will be delivered factually, furthermore, no individual will ever be asked to reveal any personal information. Relationships education, relationship and sex education (RSE) is covered within the PHSCE curriculum.
