End of Half Term Reflection & Updates

So far this term, Year 11 have made a fantastic start to their GCSEs whilst the feedback from local employers was fabulous about the attitudes our Year 10 demonstrated throughout their work experience. Students across the school, particularly in Key Stage 3, are also doing a great job in preparing for the Wizard of Oz performance while there has also been sporting success with our U13 basketball team. Our students have continued to do us proud in many ways this term!

Year 11

Today we will be speaking to Year 11 to inform them of our expectations for them to continue attending school full time after half term to allow us to support as much as possible for all GCSEs. Students will, however, begin study leave after their English examination on Friday 10th June. From this point, bespoke timetables will be shared to ensure students attend school only for their exams and lessons that they are yet to sit their exams in. More information will be shared after half term during which time we hope they find the right balance between rest and revision.

Arrival at school

More recently, we have found students entering the site really early and, as staff duties only begin at 8.25am, they are unsupervised around the school. A reminder that students should not be on the school site until 8.15am where they can access breakfast club or from 8.25am where they should congregate outside of Art/Ambleside building only. As you are aware, all students should arrive through the school gate by 8.40am and no later. Thanks for your support with ensuring students are punctual to school.

Standards Focus

After half term, we will be revisiting some of our basic standards and expectations to ensure they remain at the level we all want. Therefore, we are going to focus on a 'Tweak of the Week' which will simply be a case of revisiting one or two relatively minor things on a weekly basis. For example, the focus for the first week will be based around ensuring manners and respect, something many visitors to our school regularly say is exemplary, as well as general uniform, particularly ties. If your child does not have a tie, they must be purchased either via the school office or by logging into your Scopay Account, once purchased, can be collected from the school office.

We will tell students each Monday what the focus is, explain the rationale and ensure they are all clear on what our expectation is. Where standards are being met, students will be praised and rewarded and, in the small number of cases where they are not being met, our staff will be talking to your child and potentially parents (if appropriate) to address any issues. As always, we are sure you understand the importance in focusing on some of these basic standards and appreciate your support when addressing any concerns at all.
