THIS WEEK'S PASSOVER THEME:

Passover is a celebration of the story of Exodus. During Passover, Jews remember how their ancestors left slavery behind them when they were led out of Egypt by Moses. Passover is celebrated with a series of rituals. Each ritual symbolises a different part of the story. Passover is one of the most important festivals in the Jewish year. It is a Spring festival that begins on the 15th day of Nisan, the first month of the Jewish calendar. The celebrations last for seven or eight days, depending on where you live. In 2024 Passover began on the evening of Monday 22nd of April and ended on the 30th.



This week our theme was Passover and Mrs Sachs led the House assemblies. She engaged the students by showing them objects and foods pertinent to the important Jewish festival. She recalled stories from her childhood celebrations and explained the importance of symbolism throughout.
