- Thank you to families who attended last night's Year 9 Options Evening. It was good to see 130 families in school to speak to teachers. - There are two national teacher strikes next week, on Wednesday and Thursday. - Attendance Matters: Improving attendance is everyone's business and we all need to be obsessed with it! The rewards of attending school punctually EVERY day are enormous. It isn't just valuable, it's essential. Going to school is directly linked to improved exam performance, which should in turn lead to further learning opportunities and better job prospects. Every day matters because days off have a negative impact on learning. Even having 8 days off since September means that your child has an attendance percentage of 91! This means they are only 1% off being a Persistent Absentee. If your child is too ill to attend you should call the school by 8:30am so we can have a conversation with you about this. Medical evidence will also need to be provided. Please talk about the importance of attendance with your child, to make sure that they attend school every day- they will reap the benefits!
