We are mid term now, with 4 weeks remaining until the Christmas holidays. Our priority at the moment is to prepare our Year 11 students for their **GCSE mock examinations** over the coming weeks, starting on Monday. Year 11 students are preparing in a mature way for this ... it's a key checkpoint in letting them know where they have been successful and unsuccessful before the real event. Holiday reminders and changes.

Reminder We are all looking forward to Christmas of course! Students are not in school on Friday 3rd December. We break up for Christmas on Friday 17th December at midday. Students return on Wednesday 5th January.

Change to summer term holidays ... This year, schools have an extra day of holiday due to the Queen's Jubilee. Schools across our trust have been asked to amend this day and align it with our local primary school in the trust. For us, this is Bredbury Green Primary School. Students have had numerous assemblies over the past few weeks on revision strategies and many rewards have been given out for those students who have made an excellent start this year with their attendance to revision sessions. Assemblies have also been delivered by many of our feeder colleges and Apprenticeship providers, offering an insight into life beyond school so students can make a well-informed decision about their future pathway. Careers interviews are well underway too with over 80% of our students having applied to college already.
