Arrangements for Year 11 students are different after half term ... a note from Miss Hunt, who explains it here .... "A milestone for our Year 11 students who have worked extremely hard in their exams over the last few weeks. After half-term the arrangements are slightly different, in that Year 11 students will have completed some of their courses. This means there will be no need for them to go to that lesson. It's important to say that lessons will continue in subjects where the exam is yet to be taken. Your child will benefit from every lesson, but are not to come into school unfocussed or uncooperatively to that revision lesson. If they have no lessons in school, it is vital that they revise at home. When in school, remember that you must wear your school uniform.

Their rewards for this effort will be the whole of July and August off school, good GCSE results and a clear path Post 16 in an Apprenticeship, College or work. Please encourage them to use the half-term break wisely, rest definitely, but balance that with sustained revision. Early nights, healthy eating, exercise, socialising BUT REVISE!"

- > Students need to conduct themselves appropriately in the exams. Please support us by reminding your child that there is no talking or communication whilst an exam is taking place. Students who disrupt an exam will receive appropriate sanctions.
