Other key information for our return in September:

- Unstructured times (before school, break and lunchtime) will be split within school into two different areas, each with their own catering facilities. Years 7 and 8 will have one area in school, and Years 9, 10 and 11 will have a different area. In the mornings, Years 7 and 8 will turn left at the bottom of the school path and enter via the tennis court entrance. Years 9, 10 and 11 will turn right and enter the front student entrance.

Key messages covering a very busy end to the school year ...

It has been such a disruptive year, we have tried hard to make our final few days in school a fun and productive end to term.

COVID: Like every school, we have needed to send home quite a fewl "bubbles" at the end of term, and we know that is a disappointing end for some. Let's hope the new measures for September means this isn't a trend for the autumn term. I am still awaiting some further guidance from the government in terms of our COVID risk assessment for the return in September. I will update parents in due course with the full arrangements. However, a quick summary of the current guidance as far as I understand it currently:

- We will test all children twice if you provide your consent on return in September. This is in line with government guidance, and the aim is to prevent the spread of the virus.
- Any positive cases in September will not result in contact bubbles being sent home, unless there is a significant outbreak in school.
- Face coverings are currently not required from September
- We will have plans in place to activate if there is an outbreak, or if we require home learning to take place.

"We are Werneth". I am sure that, like me, you were appalled by some of the behaviour from so-called England fans following the final a few weeks ago. The disrespect and disregard for fellow human beings, regardless of their nationality or colour, is rightly being challenged moving forward. It's something that schools are highly conscious about. We try very hard to instil the characteristics of what it is to be a positive, caring individual into our students. COVID has - in our experience - been unhelpful to human relationships in and out of school, and that involves young people and older people. We want to start looking ahead to how we can interact better with each other. We all get it wrong sometimes! Last week, members of staff in school led a co-ordinated programme across every teaching group in school to deliver the same message around "We are Werneth" and the importance of us working together. Students produced a set of their own guidelines on how we conduct ourselves in school, centred around our **Education Learning Trust** core values of

COLLABORATE <> EMPOWER <> ACHIEVE.

Students were very reflective and have created some key statements that will form our code of conduct for the new year. Thanks to everyone for your involvement.

Y10 Careers Fair: Mrs Howell, our in-school careers lead, was delighted with the interest and enthusiasm from Year 10 when we held our careers event for them in school on Wednesday 14th July. The focus of the event was to enable students to explore post-16 options available to them, in line with their passions, ambitions and future career goals. Free School Meal Support for the Summer: A Message from Stockport Council - COVID Local Support Grant Vouchers over summer:

Stockport Council are able to continue to support families in receipt of Free School Meals with vouchers to help cover the cost of food and other essentials this summer holiday. We are also able to extend this offer to other families in receipt of Universal Credit. Families of school-age children who are eligible for income-based Free School Meals, or those who receive Universal Credit, are being provided with vouchers to help with the costs of food this summer holiday. Where the council does not hold an email address for a family, paper Aldi vouchers will be issued.

Families with eligible children will receive vouchers to the value of £10 per child, per week of the summer holiday. In total, this means that for each eligible primary and nursery age child, families will receive £50, and for each secondary pupil, £60. <u>Vouchers will be sent in two instalments</u> this summer and the total value divided evenly across each payment. This means that each round will contain vouchers valued at £25 for primary and nursey aged children, or £30 for secondary aged pupils. The first instalment will be issued in the w/c 19 July and the second instalment in w/c 9 August. *NB Please do not contact Werneth School in the event of any issue with this scheme - you will need to contact Stockport Council directly.*

Staff changes: The end of a school year is always a time to say goodbyes, and welcome new staff. Werneth School is fully staffed for September, and I will introduce you to our new staff when we return. In the meantime though, I want to recognise some of our staff who are leaving us.

We wish them all a very happy retirement. We also say goodbye to two other members of our learning support department - **Mr Torkington and Mr Wiggan** - who leave us to train to become teachers. I am sure that both will be an asset to our profession. We have also had a number of graduate one year support staff working in Maths (Miss Black), Science (Miss McNeil) and History (Mr Potter), and they leave for pastures new as well. **We thank our departing staff for their service to our young people at Werneth School.**

And finallyit has been an extraordinary year, and we all hope for a return to non-COVID education as our core priority in the next school year. I want to thank Werneth staff for their extraordinary dedication this year despite all of the challenges that we have faced, and I want to thank our children and families for their
