Refer to the past or future as well as the present.</li> <li>Work out the meaning in short authentic texts.</li> <li>Translate longer sentences into English, showing understanding of grammar.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>READ</li> <li>Understand a range of short and longer texts which include opinions and refer to the present, the past and the future.</li> <li>Translate into English short passages containing a variety of tenses, vocabulary and grammatical structures</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>SPEAK</li> <li>Take part in simple conversations, referring to the present or the future.</li> <li>Exchange opinions and give simple reasons</li> <li>Describe information in short discussions using a range of vocabulary and grammar.</li> <li>Begin to use opinions freely</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>SPEAK</li> <li>Take part in short conversations on a range of topics, describing, informing, expressing opinions and giving reasons.</li> <li>Be able to ask some questions of your own design.</li> <li>Speak in the past or future, as well as the present. Use a range of vocabulary and grammar.</li> <li>Some accurate pronunciation.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>SPEAK</li> <li>Take part in longer conversations, expressing and justifying opinions, giving detail and referring to the present, the past and the future.</li> <li>Mostly accurate pronunciation</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>WRITE</li> <li>Write short texts for different purposes using mainly memorised language, referring to the present or the future.</li> <li>Express opinions and give simple reasons.</li> <li>Translate simple sentences into language.</li> <li>Generally accurate in target language simple sentences.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>WRITE</li> <li>Write short texts giving and seeking information and opinions, referring to the past or future as well as the present.</li> <li>Translate longer sentences into target language, including some grammar.</li> <li>Mostly accurate, and meaning is clear with some minor errors.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>WRITE</li> <li>Use style and register appropriately in familiar settings.</li> <li>Translate into the target language longer sentences containing linked ideas and grammar.</li> </ul>
