The English Baccalaureate (EBacc) was introduced as a performance measure for schools in England in the 2010 performance tables. It is not a qualification. The measure recognises students that have achieved a Grade 4 or better in five subjects: GCSE English, Mathematics, a Science or Computer Science, a modern foreign language, and History or Geography. Students who are considering entry to a top university or on to a competitive course such as Medicine, Law, English would be best advised to choose the EBacc subjects. For students hoping to go to university, the Russell Group guide on making informed choices for sixth form education identifies "facilitating subjects" at A level. These are the subjects most likely to be required or preferred for entry to degree courses and ones that will keep the most options open. The subjects they identify are those included in the English Baccalaureate: English, Mathematics, the Sciences, Geography, History, Computer Science and Languages

On the Ebacc pathway **one subject** is selected from each option.
