## What you need to know about your GCSEs


GCSE Qualifications have changed a lot over the recent years....

- In 2019 all subjects graded 9-1 in place of A\*-G.
- Most GCSE examinations will be taken at the end of Year 11 with greatly reduced or removal of Controlled Assessment along the way.
- Vocational qualifications might have more coursework content.





#### **Expected Standard**




- A grade 4 is a 'standard pass' and a grade 5 a 'strong pass' at GCSE.
- Further education centres will ask for a grade 4 or better in English Language and Mathematics (with a requirement to resit if this is not achieved).
- Usually a grade 6 or higher is needed to study a subject at A Level




All students will study the CORE curriculum and then additional subjects will be selected from the option choices.

### Werneth Pathways

- Each student in year 9 has been placed on one of two pathways; The Ebacc
   Pathway or the Open Pathway. A Pathway means a combination of subjects, but you will still have lots of choice, regardless of the pathway that you are on.
- All subject teachers have been looking at the best pathway for you, based on what they know about your abilities and the performance data that we hold. We have selected the best pathway to meet your needs.
- We believe that the appropriate pathway will enable you to attain, achieve and maximise your potential, both in school and beyond.





## The English Baccalaureate (Ebacc) pathway

 This pathway will be chosen for students who are achieving well in all core subjects, humanities and a Modern Foreign Language. This stands at about 30% of our current year 9 cohort.

• The English Baccalaureate is not a qualification but a group of carefully chosen subjects that are the most sought-after qualifications for university, college and for employers. It is a more academic route and is the best pathway for students who are considering A-Levels, University or to keep their options open for their future careers.







## The Open Pathway

- This pathway gives an equally wide choice of subjects. It is a slightly less academic route.
- The Open Pathway will allow for a broad and balanced selection of subjects, with a blend of academic and more practical/vocational options.
- One option choice on the open pathway will be from the Ebacc choice of subjects.





What choice is there?


Students can select 4 subjects as part of the Options process in year 9 to study in years 10 and 11.


#### These will include:

- At least one EBacc subject where students choose a Modern Foreign Language,
   History or Geography (or Computer Science on the Open pathway).
- At least two free choices. We encourage students to choose something that they enjoy or a practical / technical subject to balance the curriculum.

## Will I always get all of my choices?

No – but we will do our best. It is very rare that we can not offer a chosen option.

Possible reasons that you may not get your option choices:

- Too many students may select a subject.
- Too few students may select a subject.
- It will not be possible to study every combination of subjects.





## DO

- Choose subjects that you enjoy, or that you think you will enjoy.
  - Choose subjects/courses where you will succeed.
    - Choose subjects where you will fully take part
      - PE -do you bring your kit?
    - > Food Preparation & Nutrition—do you usually bring ingredients?





## DO NOT

- Choose a subject because your friend has chosen it!
- Choose a subject the because you like the teacher....you will not necessarily get that teacher next year!





## Before you make your choices make sure you:

- READ the options booklet carefully
- TALK
  - to subject teachers
  - to your form tutor
  - to pupils in Years 10 & 11
  - Careers staff, colleges etc
- Find out about post 16 courses and training that you might want to do
- ASK -everyone will try to help and advise you
