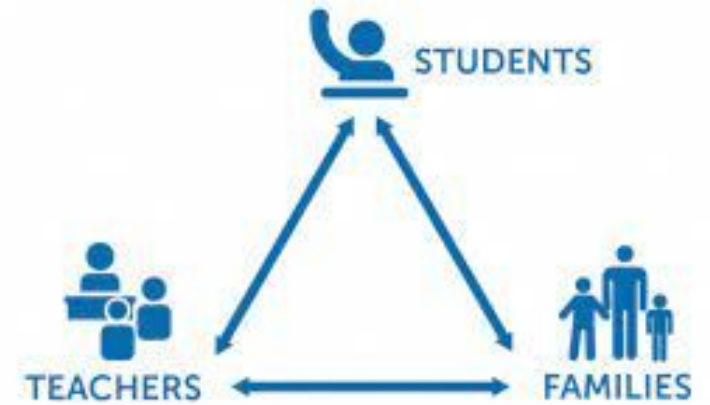

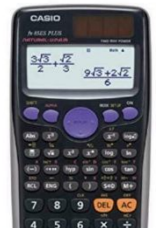
Uniform and Equipment

- Blazers are compulsory and worn at all times.
- Ties must reach just above the naval.
- Skirts must reach just above the knee.
- Trousers must be 'school style'.
- Black socks or tights only, socks must be worn below the knee.
- Plain black, below the ankle school shoes should be worn. No trainers or sports branded shoes.



Uniform and Equipment

- Uniform and equipment is checked daily at the school gate, school entrance, during form time and at the start of every lesson.
- Students require a minimum of a blue/black pen (and spare), pencil, rubber, ruler and scientific calculator.
- All students must have a suitable, dark coloured school bag which will fit an A4 folder.
- All students must have their planner displayed in form time and every lesson.

WERNETH SCHOOL

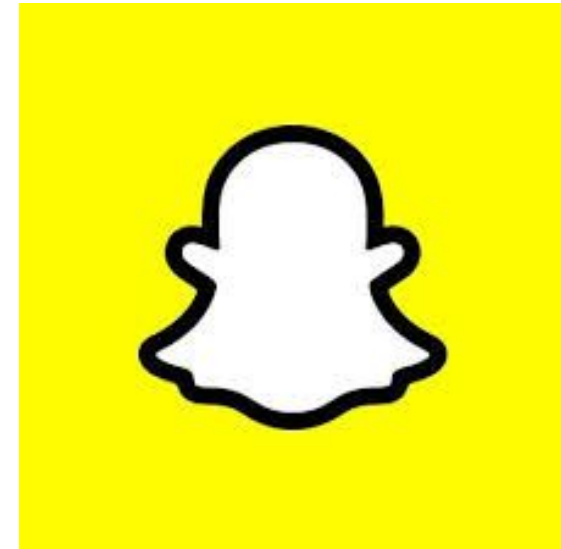
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TO FINISH...

- Phone every day of absence. 0161 494 1222, option 2 **or** use the Edulink App.

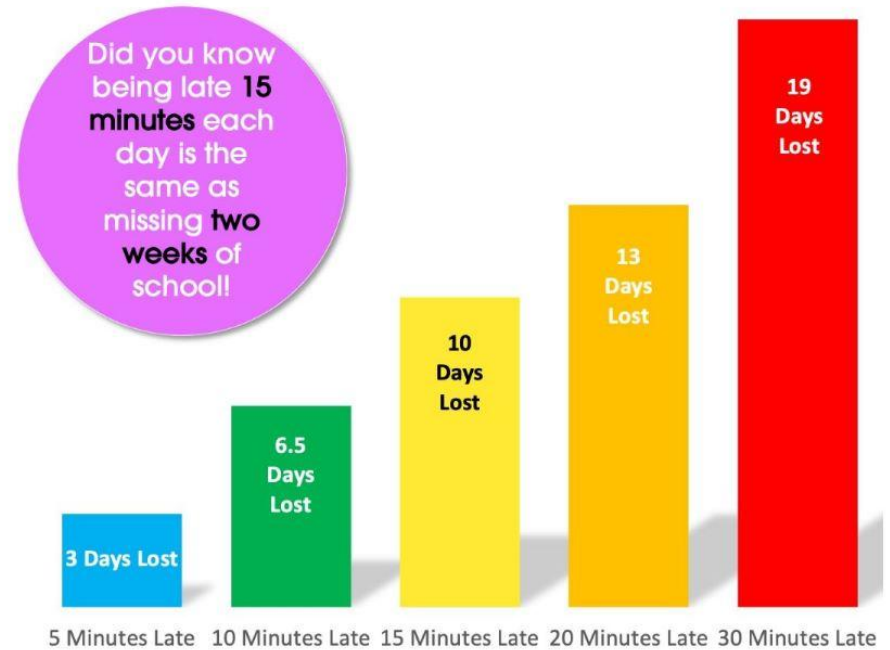
- Ensure good attendance and punctuality is a priority for all those involved in the school community.

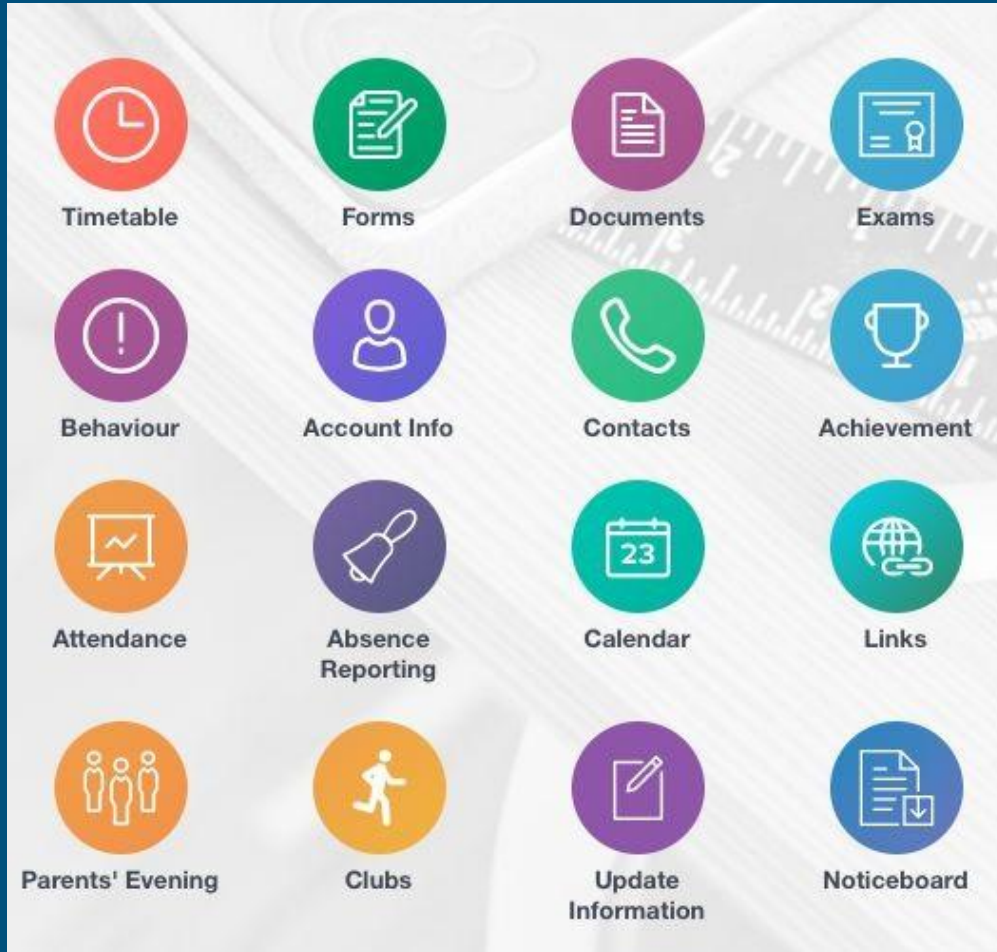
