

Werneth School Hub Half Term Review

Match Tickets

Werneth school have had the opportunity for students to attend Manchester United matches at Old Trafford. There have been a total of 5 students who have experienced a match day in this half term. They have varied in age and gender. They have been chosen due to 100% attendance, or 0 behaviour logs on sims in this half term. This was a certain way for the school to reward the students who are consistently in school and consistently behaving. The tickets have been received for the Premier League games against Bournemouth, Chelsea, Everton, West Brom, Liverpool, Hull and Watford. Also received tickets for the Europa League game against Rostov, the EFL cup game against Hull, and the FA cup game against Wigan.



Hub Tournaments

In this half term, Werneth students have taken part in 3 Hub tournaments. This is a great opportunity for the students to meet other students from different Manchester United Foundation hub schools, who are in similar situations as themselves. The Year 9 boys took part in the Hub tournament at Manchester Academy on the 10/3/17. There were 10 boys in total who took part. The second tournament was held for a mixture of Year 7/8 girls on the 24/3/17 at Waterhead Academy. There were a total of 11 girls who took part. The third tournament was for the Year 8/9 girls at Whalley Range High School. There were a total of 8 girls who participated.



One Goal for Education Project

As part of the Key 103 Media course, the 2 students from Werneth School have been busy this term filming the HDOs Mentoring work within Werneth. This has been a chance to practice what they have learnt on the different days with Key 103. They used a variety of different camera angles, lighting and different methods to capture the mentoring that takes place, this has included interviewing students on the programme, teachers who teach the students on a daily basis, and videoing the students in action working 1 to 1 with the HDO. They will continue to work on this with the HDO until further training days are pencilled in.



Foundation



Business Enterprise

We worked closely with the Business Studies department to organise for the Year 10 Business students to take part in the Enterprise programme. The aim of the programme was to assist the Year 10s in their GCSE coursework. The students are required to talk and write about a business and how it runs. So as part of our partnership, we thought it was a great idea to use Manchester United as the business. There were a total of 38 students who participated. The first day involved doing a presentation in Werneth with the students with the information they need for their coursework. We then took the students to Old Trafford on 22/3/17 for day 2 to continue the programme.

Steps to a Brighter Future – careers programme

The HDO has worked closely with the school to start up a new Careers programme within the school, Steps to a Brighter Future. The programme includes Apprenticeships, Colleges, Universities and Businesses coming in to the school every fortnight to show a presentation to students who want to come along. It gives the students the chance to ask questions relating to the visitors that attend Werneth. In this half term, the HDO completed visits to the Sharp project, MMU visit, Event city fair, a visit from a childcare apprenticeship and the Pro Football Academy. The University visit was to MMU in Manchester (2/2/17). This was aimed at looking at the Skills Apprenticeship. The students had a workshop with the tutors from the University and found it really beneficial. We had 20 Year 8 pupil premium students visit MMU. The in school visit was from a childcare apprenticeship company. A tutor presented a slide show to the students in attendance, and was aimed at looking at the background of the company and what it can offer to benefit the students. It was a great chance for the students to stay behind and ask questions more personalised to the student and their aspirations. There were 16 students in attendance for the in school visit on the 25/1/17. The Sharp project was aimed at pupil premium students, to get them out to see the different ways in which business run in the real world. There were 20 pupils attended the visit on the 7/3/17. Off the back of the visit one of the HDOs mentees was selected to go back for work experience for a day to learn more about the different businesses within the Sharp project. The second in school visit was by a company called the Pro Football Academy. The aim of the academy is to take on young footballers, who will balance doing college work and playing football at a local college. The Academy has a link with Stockport County FC, which shows a progression route in to full time football. There was a total of 16

students who attended on the 1/3/17. The HDO assisted the school on a trip to Event city careers fair on the 30/3/17. We took the Year 11s down to the event, and there were a total of 188 students who participated.



MFL Event

This event took place at Stretford High School, one of our Hub schools, on the 16/2/17. The event consisted of a French theme due to Manchester United playing St Etienne in the Europa League. There were workshops for the students to complete, and also involved a game of football outside.

There were 7 Year 7 students who got selected for the event due to their interest in MFL within Werneth. The students involved also received tickets for the St Etienne match that night, and got to take a parent/guardian with them. This was a great opportunity for the student and adult to spend some time together in a different environment.

Show the Love Event

The Foundation arranged a Show the Love event on the 14/2/17 at Old Trafford for their partner Hubs. Show the Love is a campaign brought about by The Climate Coalition – a group of more than 100 charities who care about climate change, from UNICEF and Oxfam to the National Trust and the Women's Institute. The campaign has Valentine's Day as its focal point and the Green Heart as its emblem. On the day the students took part in different work stations, each one aimed at educating them about the environment and how they can positively affect it both at home and at school. The students also gained knowledge around how small changes can have a greater impact on a regional, national and worldwide scale. There were 8 Year 8 students selected for the event, and they were chosen based on their attitudes in school, and being on the student council at Werneth.



RAF Intervention

Due to the partnership between the RAF and the Foundation, the HDO and Werneth decided to bring the RAF in once a month to do some intervention work with groups from Year 10 and 11, mixture of boys and girls. We started by holding a full Year 10 assembly on the 19/1/17, this included 200 students. We brought the RAF staff in to deliver a presentation on the background of the RAF and what it has to offer. The HDO then spoke with the Heads of Year 10 and 11 to select the cohorts for the programme. The first two days the RAF delivered practical lessons were on the 16/3/17 and 17/3/17. On the 16/3/17 we had 1 group of 11 Year 10 students, and 1 group of 9 Year 11 students. And on the 17/3/17 there was 1 group of 9 Year 11 students and 1 group of 10 Year 10 students. The sessions delivered were based around team work skills, and different ways to communicate to complete tasks given to the group.



Hidden Figures

The Hidden Figures event was a film based on the STEM subjects, and involved watching a movie premiere at the Odeon Cinema in the Trafford Centre on the 26/1/17. There were 11 Year 7 girls selected to attend this event, based on their attitude to learning and interest in the STEM subjects within school. The event was hosted by some of the leading women in the working industry. There was a panel of 'Inspirational' STEM professionals and experts who outlined and highlighted their journey in the environment of different professions. We then offered a Q & A session before the start of the film between the panel and audience, and was a great opportunity for the students to ask questions about how to reach their future goals.

Football Fun Day

The Football fun day was a massive opportunity for 5 students from Year 9 to attend the Manchester United training ground, Carrington. The event was held indoors, and involved different footballing workshops/tasks around the indoor pitch, for example, football darts, football bowling. The students were selected due to their high sporting ability and consistent good behaviour and attitude within school. The students then got a surprise as they were joined by some of the first team squad, as they were moving around each station. The players included: Paul Pogba, Juan Mata,




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Anthony Martial, Antonio Valencia. The players were great with the students, answering questions the students had to ask them, and spent some time offering advice for the students to take on board.



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Next Move – Careers Fair

The Next move careers fair (23/3/17) was an event set up for the first time this year. The aim of the event was to give the students an idea of the different jobs in the working world, and how they can achieve their goals. The event was made up of different workshops from different businesses, colleges, and apprenticeships. They included Salford City College, Wates, The Manchester College, Manchester United Foundation Hub Manager, RAF. There were 17 Year 10s selected for the event, and were selected on the basis to give them more ideas and to think about the future they would like to get in to. They had the opportunity to visit each workshop, participate in practical sessions, and ask any questions they may have at the end.
