The partnership between Werneth School and Manchester United Foundation began on 1<sup>st</sup> June 2016.








## **High School Interventions**







The aims of the **Mentoring** program are to **support our young people** by providing them with the individual support that they need and to **engage** them on their studies and **future** path to reach their **potential**.

The program focuses on **educational** and **behavioural improvements.** The HDO will monitor these through a number of different methods that will be tailored to the school. These will range from bespoke report cards, mentoring league tables, weekly student meetings, teacher feedback etc.







- The mentoring league has been set up where the individual students are challenging against one another on a weekly basis to see who can collect the most points based on their challenges set (arrive to lessons on time, complete all class work, acceptable behaviour) for the week.
- The points work from **1-4** (**1** being target **not achieved**, **4** being **excelled** in achieving target).
- There is then a league table updated every week to show the students how they are doing, and seeing the improvements. The league table also helps the disengaged students stay motivated throughout.
- The HDO has worked with 24 students over the academic year on the Mentoring programme, with 20 of these students on the programme for the duration of the year.



#### **7 MENTORING LEAGUE TABLE**





- **13** of the mentoring students have shown **improvements/not declined** with their **Attitude to** Learning scores, from the end of last academic year until now.
- This is **65%** of the students that where in the mentoring league all Academic Year. •
- 5 has the most significant increase of nearly a whole point increase over the Academic Year •





- D is a **Year 10** student at Werneth. He started working with the HDO at the start of this academic year and has done so throughout the year.
- He has been involved in this years Year 10 **Sports Leaders** programme, which has seen him come out of his shell more, and **increased his confidence**. Due to this he has been helping out with certain sessions such as **Sports Day**, and a **primary legacy games** day held at Werneth.
- D attitude to learning score **increased** from **1.62** at the end of last academic year to 2.50 at the end of this academic year.



- J is a **Year 8** student at Werneth. He has shown improvements with his behaviours and attitude since starting work with the HDO at the start of this academic year.
- One particular highlight is his **increased self confidence** and self belief. He was a very shy young person, and now interacts really well with groups within school and joins in with more football sessions as the weeks develop.
- His attitude to learning has **increased** from **2.07** at the end of the last academic year to 2.69 at the end of this academic year.

Due to this positive increase and his all round positive display of • behaviours, J received the Manchester United Foundation award for a Year 8 student for their **progress** throughout the Academic year.



- L is a **Year 7** student, who started working with the HDO after Christmas. He was disengaged across school and showed signs of ADHD symptoms.
  - Since working with the HDO, L has **increased** his Attitude to Learning score from **1.50** before working with the HDO, to **1.86**. He has settled down massively in and around school, and engaged a lot more within lessons, and this improvement backs it up.
  - Due to this positive increase and his all round positive display of • behaviours, L received the Manchester United Foundation award for Year 7s. This award goes to a student for their **progress** throughout the Academic year.
- Lalso picked up a form tutor award and an Arts award for his hard work in Arts throughout the year, and **overall attitude**.




- J is a Year 10 student at Werneth. He has been working with the HDO for the whole • academic year.
  - J has been involved in this years Year 10 **Sports Leaders** programme, which has seen him come out of his shell more, and increased his confidence. Due to this he has been helping out with certain sessions such as **lunchtime clubs, Sports Day**, and a **primary legacy games** day held at Werneth.
- His attitude to learning reports have shown **massive improvements** from the end • of last academic year to the end of this academic year. At the end of last academic year J ATL was at **1.38**. At the end of this academic year J ATL is now at **2.22**.



- A Year 10 student on the programme was struggling with his attendance. The HDO worked closely with this student specifically to get in to school more, and to reduce the amount of lates to school/lessons.
- The mentees attendance up to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2017 was at 70.8%.
  - The mentees attendance now currently stands at 82.4%.
  - As a result of his increase to attendance, he also shown improvements with his Attitude to Learning average from

#### **1.62 – 2.25**.





### **Business Enterprise Programme**

- We worked closely with the Business Studies department to organise for the Year 9 Business students to take part in the Enterprise programme. The aim of the programme is to assist the Year 9s in their understanding of Business Studies.
- There are a total of 40 students who are participating. The Foundation have started running a Business Enterprise core programme, on a weekly basis with students from Year 9 who have selected Business Studies as a GCSE. Throughout the course, students will learn about the various departments and potentially meet key members from each department.
- During the programme, the students worked on improving their soft skills such as: Communication, decision making, team work and confidence.





### Lunchtime Football

- A **Lunchtime club** was set up between the HDO and lunch duty staff at Werneth.
- The lunchtime club runs every day and on average each day seen approx. 150 students on the Astro playing • football and approx. 40 students indoor in the sports hall playing a variety of sports including: Badminton, table tennis, basketball, netball.
- Every day sees the Year 10 Sports Leaders helping the HDO and PE Staff indoors and outdoors. Their roles while on duty include:

- organising equipment,
- distributing equipment to students,
- tidying up the facility,
- timekeeping
- collecting the equipment in at the end,
- making sure it's a fun,
- friendly environment.



## Literacy Intervention

- **20 Year 7** students were identified to participate in an intervention group, Goal Group, to help with their Literacy skills.
- The sessions looked to link literacy with sport, to make it more **engaging** • and help the students enjoy reading and writing.
- The sessions will be student led for the majority of sessions to improve • independent learning.










## Literacy Intervention Impact

- Of the **20** students who **participated** in the **Goal Group** literacy intervention, **17 Year 7s** have • improved their Reading age. Their Reading age was tested before they started with the programme, and re tested at the end of the academic year.
- There were big **improvements** with **5** individual students where they improved their Reading age by over 2 years. Find the results on the following slide.
- Overall as a group of **20**, the Reading age improved by **+1.02 years**. •

## Leadership Programme

- The HDO has set up a leadership programme for Year 10 students who have shown an interest in becoming sports leaders. The students interested were asked to fill in an application form, helping them being able to talk about their achievements to date and to be proud.

- problem solving when under pressure.
- There are a total of **35** students **engaging** with the programme.






### Leadership Programme

### Attendance League


- This whole school intervention was set up in partnership with the school, to raise the attendance of students as an each individual, the form group, the year group and eventually as a school.
- It was highlighted and emphasised to each student the importance of attending school every day.
- Each week form groups will play a fixture against a different form group. The winner will get;
- 3 points for recording a high group attendance that the other form,
- for a 'draw on recorded attendance' both forms would get 2 points,
- 1 point if over the form group matched the school target %,
- 2 bonus points if a form group gets 100% for that week.
- These points then get added to a league table, there is a 'Manager of the Fortnight' and a winner from each year group at the end of each term.





#### Attendance League Impact

• There were 12 standout forms, who have improved their Attendance from the block September 2017 – December 2017, to January 2018 – July 2018.

#### Attendance

- The HDO has been working with a **Year 11** student who was a **school refuser** for the whole of Year 10. •
- The HDO visited the student along with his **social worker**, to sit down and **discuss** the students situation. The **aim** • of the visit was to see what their aspirations were, and most importantly why the student refused to come in to school.
- Prior to the visit on the **22<sup>nd</sup> June 2017**, the students **attendance** for the year was **6.5%**.
- Since the visit, and an **agreement** between the student, the HDO and school on a **part time timetable** with sport • used as a **reward** at the end of the day, the **attendance** rose to **15.3%**.
- From September 2017 until December 2017, D attendance was at an incredible **96.4%**.





#### Attendance

- After Christmas 2017, D attended a college placement where he was attending college every • day.
- Initially there was confusion around the actual course he would be studying and his timetable, ۲ but this was resolved and he still participated in the course.
- D has also attended and completed his Maths, English and Science GCSEs at the end of this • academic year. D is awaiting his results, regardless of the outcome this is a massive achievement considering he was not even attending school this time in the last academic year.
- Finally D, has been attending our newly formed Street Reds football session at Werneth, where • it has been planned that D will develop his leadership skills and at the appropriate time D will start to begin recorded volunteering for MUFoundation at the Street Reds session.



### After School Football – Year 7 Boys

- The HDO worked closely with the Year 7 boys football team, with the main focus being around team • work, and basic game awareness.
- The sessions were mainly on **Tuesdays** afterschool depending on when league and cup games were arranged. The numbers were consistently at **40** attendees.
- This includes league matches, cup games and friendlies. •





- The Year 6 football/netball tournaments are currently offered out to the Primary schools that feed in to Werneth school.
- The first tournament was held on the 26<sup>th</sup> September 2017 at Werneth School and was aimed at the high achievers in sport. There were 8 teams participating in total with approx. 160 students taking part. The HDO had 8 sports leaders from Werneth to help with the running of the tournaments. 4 were Year 11 boys and 4 were Year 11 girls.
- They assisted with refereeing the matches, setting pitches up, and collecting scores to complete the group standings. The schools who took part included: Arden, Bredbury Green, Woodley, St Marks, Romiley, St Christopher's and Greave.



- The second tournament was held on the 17<sup>th</sup> October 2017 at Werneth School. This was aimed for the students who loved sport that didn't attend the 'high achievers' tournament. There were a total of 6 primary schools who participated on this day, they included: Arden, Bredbury Green, Romiley, St Christopher's, Woodley and Greave.
- There were a total of 120 students who took part. The sports leaders for this tournament consisted of 11 Year 11s, and a mixture of boys and girls.

- The HDO had **11** sports leaders from Werneth to help with the running of the tournaments.

- The HDO managed to see all Year 5 and Year 6 students. It was a great event, all the students **engaged brilliantly** with some great questions being asked.









There were a total of **124 Year 7** and **113 Year 8** students. The event took place on **Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> July**.






- There have been a total of **77** students who have participated in the Man United Foundation Hub football tournaments throughout this first term of the academic year.



• As a result of their **excellent behaviour** at the party, the students each received some **Christmas presents** from the Foundation as a little thank you token.





- Manchester United Foundation held an event at Old Trafford on Monday 27th November around **Resilience**. There was a guest speaker Dean Stott who spoke about the challenges he has faced in his life, and how he overcome these obstacles to get to where he is now.
- He spoke about attempting a World Record cycling challenge 'The Pan American Highway 18'. The total distance he will travel is 14,000 miles and he was aiming to do so in 110 days. The charity he is raising money for is 'Heads together'.
- Dean completed 'The Pan American Highway 18' challenge, and done so in 99 days, 12 hours and 56 minutes, knocking a very impressive 17 days off the previous record.
- There were **4** Year 8 students who attended this event, and engaged with the workshops really well.





### Show the Love

On the 8th of February, we went on a rewards trip to Old Trafford through the Manchester United Foundation. This was our annual event called 'Show the love'.

This event is an environmental educational event which provided information and learning around the effects of climate change and the potential effects at home, school, Nationally and Globaly.

Alongside this information, the students were taught how to present a campaign to an audience. For this task the Werneth students decided to carry on this campaign and call it 'Werneth's Greener Future.'

The students continued this task when returning to school and entering the post-event competition. To everyone's delight, the students hardwork, enthusiasm and efforts were rewarded by successfully winning the competition (Green Hearts Award) and receiving 'a trip to London and £300 prize money for the school'.





#### Show the Love




- The trip to the 'Green Heart Award' was a great success and provided the students with life long memories. The group travelled from Stockport train station and arrived at London Euston. They then travelled on the Underground to arrive at Green Park station. The students then had time to visit Buckingham Palace, St James's Palace, the London eye, Tower bridge, Downing Street, Westminster Abbey and the Houses of Parliament.
- Amazingly the students then had a tour around Parliament with William Wragg, our local MP, who took us around The Houses Of Parliament and informed us on the history of Parliament. The students then got an exclusive seat in the speakers house to watch a debate about free school meals. After watching the debate, they went to another part of Parliament to take part in the 'Green Hero Heart Awards', where we got a mention just before the award for 'the best youth/school project'.



## **Army Residential**

- **12** of our Year 10 students had the opportunity to represent Werneth at an **Army Residential** through the Manchester United Foundation and the Army.
- On Day 1 the students participated in team building challenges in the morning, gradually improving as the challenges went on. In the afternoon the students then visited the live shooting range, where they had the opportunity to use the weapons in a controlled environment to hit specific targets.





## **Army Residential**

- Day 2 saw the students complete the assault course, with many overcoming fears and going out of their comfort zone to achieve. The residential concluded with a team 'Gun Run' challenge. The students had to work in a team, travelling a total distance of 1.5km, to locate objects including tree logs, tyres, barrels and medicine balls hidden around the campus. They showed great team work and leadership skills to win this challenge ahead of the other three schools in attendance.
- This challenge summed up the students' attitude and behaviour while on the residential, where they represented Werneth really well.

- There were a total of **44** students across the two year groups who engaged with the event.





## BSMP (Business Social Mobility Programme)

- 5 students from Year 11 were selected to take part in a work experience placement at Eversheds Sutherland in Manchester where they gained experience working in law and legal affairs.
- During the work experience placement the students took part in negotiation and presentation workshops, court visits and contract negotiations as well as networking sessions and building communication skills to help develop confidence and self esteem.
- At the end of the week the students took part in some volunteering at a local charity to help renovate the facilities.



### **RAF STEM Science Event**

- **9** Year 9 students were chosen to attend this event at Old Trafford on **21<sup>st</sup> June 2018**. The students were targeted for students high achieving in Science or interested in a future with the **RAF** or to raise **aspirations**.
- The event consisted of working in small groups to build a propeller plane, and see which groups could fly the furthest. This was great for the students to work on their **soft skills** such as: Team work, communication, organisation, confidence and problem solving.
- The main focus was **Engineering** and trying to inform students of how that looks within the RAF.

- Our current Year 7s have had the opportunity to visit Old Trafford this term as part of their Life Learning curriculum and enjoyed the occasion: they had a tour of the museum at Manchester United.
- Their behaviour was exemplary on every visit: we took them in small groups over the week.
- This opportunity forms a part of the Adidas Academy programme, where we prepare our youngest students with the skills that they need in order to be successful in later life.



#### Street Reds

- This is a community programme, run by the Manchester United Foundation with their qualified coaches, on Friday nights at Werneth and is open to any young people aged 8-18.
- The aim of the sessions are to increase **social skills, confidence** and football skills.
- Each week there are between 25 40 participants, with their behaviour and attitudes being exceptional.
- One highlight has been Year 9 student R, also an HDO mentee, and has developed her **confidence** to start helping out with some sessions.





#### **Street Reds**

#### Q- How do you feel you have developed helping at the Street Reds sessions?

" I feel that I have developed in many areas, one being confidence as I am now finding it easier to join in with speaking to new people and helping the children."

#### **Q-** Do you feel more confident to begin delivering parts of sessions?

"Yes I now feel a lot more confident from when I first started, this was shown when I delivered a 10 minute activity (penalty shootout) with a group of children aged 8-11 years old, which I enjoyed."

#### **Q-** What is it that you enjoy about helping at Werneth Street Reds?

" I enjoy helping out at street reds as it helps me work on my leadership skills and to improve them. Working and helping the younger children makes me feel proud that I can help in some way. I enjoy having responsibility."

#### **Q-** What is it that you want to do in the future?

" I want to be involved in sport, and I feel that helping out at street reds this will help me develop skills to set me on my way."



### Match Tickets

- This season the HDO has organised the Match Tickets so they are spread out around the different year groups fairly, and give members of staff the chance to nominate students for **excellent pieces** of work, **high attenders** and **consistent good behaviours**.
- There have been a total of 9 students who have won tickets for the second term.





#### Ball Assistant



- **Callum** was selected to **represent** Werneth this season at • every home Man United game as a ball assistant.
- This role looked to push Callum further with his confidence, social skills, team work and leadership.
- Callum has had a positive year with this role and really • enjoyed his responsibilities.
- 'I **loved** this experience and scored it a **5** out of **5**. This is because I enjoyed working and meeting with new people, helping out Manchester United first team.'
- 'I also thought it helped me to develop my **social** skills, • communication skills and team work skills."



#### **Ball Assistant**

- Amy has been selected to represent Werneth next season at every home Man United game as a ball assistant.
- This role will look to push Amy further with her **confidence**, **social skills, team work and leadership.**
- Amy was the eventual winner after the current Year 9s went through an application process which concluded with a sit down interview.
- 'I am over the moon to be selected for the Ball Assistant role next season. I feel it will help me with my future as I will be improving my communication skills, and working with others whilst under pressure.'
