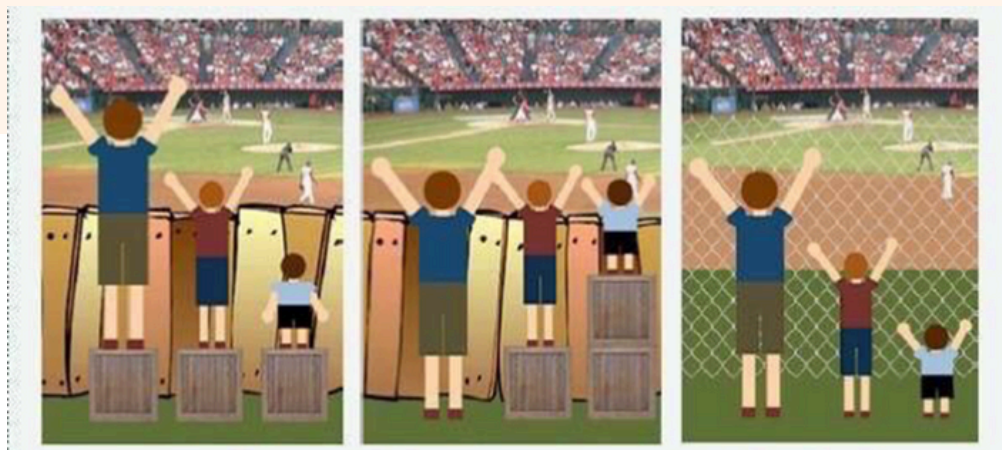
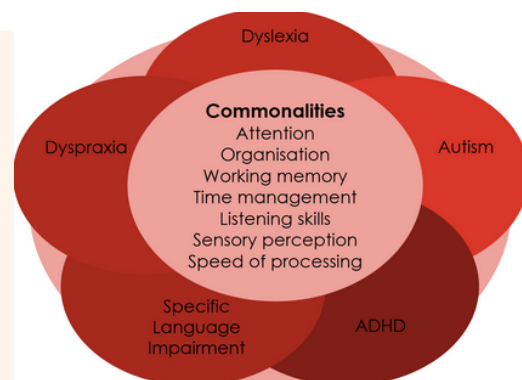

Whole staff training

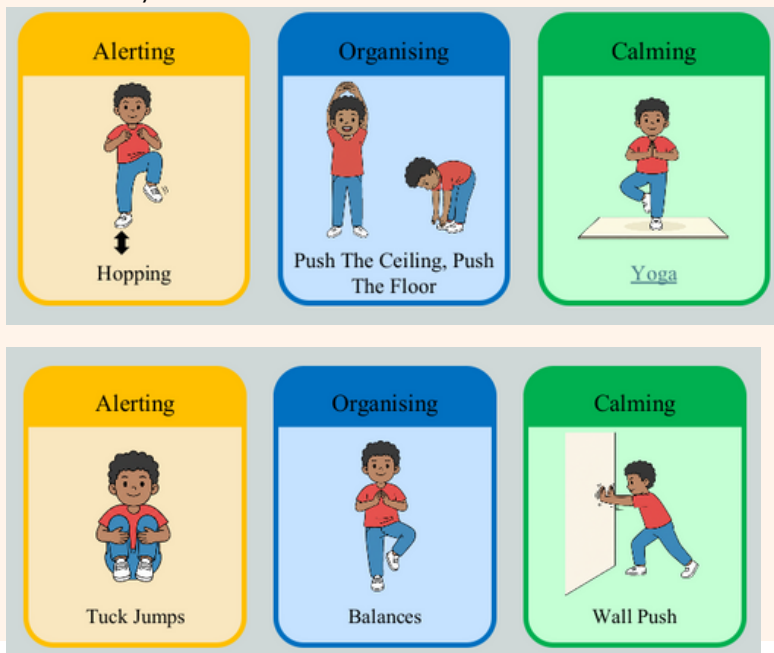
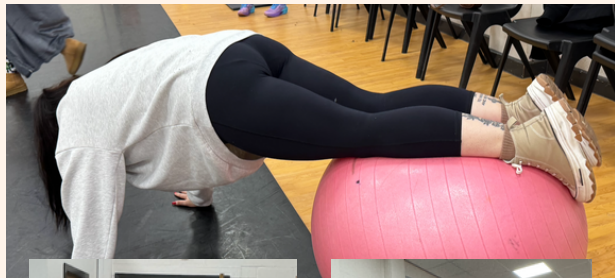
On Monday 5th January, all staff were in school to take part in an Inset day. Mrs Warren, our new SENCO, delivered a training session to all staff focusing on the ideas, ethos and principles behind inclusive education in the English education system and how, as teaching staff, we have a responsibility to work together to ensure everyone is able to reach their potential. Mrs Warren covered topics such as the medical verses the social model of disability, how important 'labels' are (or are not!) within the SEND community and commonalities between differing areas of need. Teachers explored EHCPs from different students within our school and were asked to consider what they should be doing to remove barriers and ensure all students can access learning.

This is part of an ongoing series of training sessions delivered to all staff within our school to ensure every member of staff is helping our children to succeed.



SEND department training

During the staff inset day, the SEND department team had training on the interventions we offer. Our SEND team really enjoyed taking part in the sensory circuits programme we offer to our students! It was great to experience one of the interventions we offer to our students and feel how beneficial it can be. Supporting our Students

One of the changes we are introducing this term is the introduction of Key Worker Groups. Once a month, all students on our SEND register will meet in a small group with a familiar Teaching Assistant for a relaxed check-in focused on wellbeing and progress. These sessions give students a safe space to talk about how things are going, celebrate successes, and share any worries, while also helping staff understand how best to support them in school.

Key Worker Groups are designed to build strong relationships, boost confidence, and ensure each student feels listened to and supported. The sessions will also allow us to identify any problems early and intervene where necessary.

Our teaching assistants will be in touch with parents with updates following these meetings so that you are kept up to date on your child's progress in school.

Exploring Autism Parent/Carer course



Exploring Autism is a one-off session delivered by Stockport Neurodevelopmental Team. It is designed for parents and carers of children with an Autism diagnosis.

During this session, we will explore the journey following diagnosis with discussion about the key areas of difference; helpful strategies to use at home; parental wellbeing; and further sources of support in Stockport.

We recognise that some parents joining us will have their own neurodevelopmental needs and we provide the opportunity for you to let us know about any accessibility needs you have prior to the session.

To be eligible to book onto this session, parents/ carers must:

- Live in Stockport
- Have a child who attends a Stockport school
- Have a child who is school age (4-16)
- Have a child or care for a child with an autism diagnosis

Exploring Neurodiversity Parent/Carer course

Exploring Neurodiversity is a one-off session delivered by Stockport Neurodevelopmental Team. It is designed for parents/carers and family members of neurodivergent children, whether they have a formal diagnosis, are awaiting assessment or have suspected neurodevelopmental differences.

During the session, we will introduce the term neurodiversity and talk about what it means; we will cover a range of neurodevelopmental conditions including autism, ADHD and dyslexia; and we will identify some general strategies of support that can be used at home. The session includes time for questions.
