Dear Parent,

We have come to the end of another strange half term. Next week will be a break from home learning for everyone. This may relieve some of the pressure you have been experiencing. We are looking forward to welcoming everyone back to school, hopefully next month.

Half Term Break

The Half Term break is Monday 15th February to Friday 19th February. No home learning will be set for this week. School will **reopen to critical worker children only on Mon 22nd February**.

Return to School

We are awaiting details of when we can welcome more pupils back to school. We'll be keen to hear of school news in the planned national announcement on Monday 22nd February.

Positive Covid cases

Should you have **any Covid test results**, please share these with us (whether learning at home or at school) using **covid@heslerton.n-yorks.sch.uk** so that we can alert Health England and all families as soon as possible to any contact (within 48 hours) that has taken place. Emails are checked daily, including weekends, to identify cases of children at school and home.

Keeping staff and children in school safe

On several occasions during the last few weeks, some families attending school are not following the Lockdown rules when not in school. A few are still meeting outside of school, often at the school pick up time in the village. For families who are attending school, we must insist that you adhere to the lockdown rules. If it comes to our attention that your family is not following these national Covid rules when not in school, the Governors will immediately consider your child's place in school to keep everyone else safe. This will happen irrespective of your role as a key worker.

I hope you can understand why we need to do this – please make sure you and your child follow the rules to help everyone stay healthy.

Covid testing in school for staff

Asymptomatic staff members are voluntarily testing themselves twice weekly to minimise the spread of Covid in school. We have, thankfully, had negative results so far. These tests will keep your child safer but may result in bubbles having to close and pupils isolate from school. Attendance at school will result in children and families following any local health protection team advice given. This includes track and trace; self isolation, bubble closure and possibly whole school closure. Please check Dojo daily for updates and have an alternative emergency childcare plan in place. If you do not need your child in school, please keep them at home.

After School Club

Please book ahead by phone for our after school club. Staff will be furloughed during sessions that are not needed. Telephone bookings on the day may not be possible if this facility is closed.

Feedback to school

Thank you for the feedback to school as requested in recent newsletters. I have attached the feedback we received.

Illness

Please contact us if your child is ill and unable to complete remote learning tasks at home. We will not expect completed work until your child is better.

Please do not send your child to school if they are not well. In addition to Covid, there are many other bugs around at present. We are working hard to keep regular staff with your child to prevent the spread of germs but this is not possible if staff are off poorly.
