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"Children are at the centre of all we do"

Dear Parent,

I hope you are all still managing well at home. We are pleased you are able to keep safe. Guidance for schools continues to change. The following covers the recent changes.

Half Term Break

The Half Term break is Monday 15th February to Friday 19th February. No home learning will be set for this week. School will close – staff, pupils and parents need to rest after a challenging half term. School will **reopen to critical worker children only on Mon 22nd February**.

Positive Covid cases

Should you have **any Covid symptoms or Covid test results**, please share these with us (whether learning at home or at school) using **covid@heslerton.n-yorks.sch.uk** so that we can alert Health England and all families as soon as possible to any contact that has taken place. Emails are checked every day, including weekends, to identify cases of children at school and home.

Attending school

If your child needs to attend school because a parent is a critical worker **and** at work **and there is no other safe alternative childcare,** please contact school for a space for your child. Children who are deemed vulnerable should also attend school for learning.

Children are safest at home.

Keeping staff and children in school safe

If your child is not well, please do not send them to school.

School is looking after pupils who have self-isolated after having had Covid in their homes. There is risk here at school and whilst we are doing everything we can to reduce this, we need to insist that **children stay at home whenever possible**.

It has come to our attention that during the last few weeks some of the children in school have not followed the Lockdown rules on several occasions when not in school. A few are still visiting other houses and even staying overnight. This variant of the virus is highly transmissible – far more than the original virus - and we all have a part to play in keeping our community safe. **For families who are attending school, we must insist that you adhere to the lockdown rules**. If you are in a childcare bubble, that bubble can only be with <u>one</u> other household. If it comes to our attention that your child is mixing with other families / children when not in school **the Governors will immediately consider your child's place in school** to keep everyone else safe. **This will happen irrespective of your role as a key worker.**

I hope you can understand why we need to do this – please make sure your child follows the rules to help everyone stay healthy.

Covid testing in school for staff

Staff have started voluntarily testing twice weekly to minimise the spread of the virus in school from asymptomatic people (of which it is thought 30% could be). This will keep your child safer but may result in more school bubbles having to close and pupils isolate from school. **Please have an alternative emergency childcare plan in place**. Please check Dojo daily for updates of bubbles closing and/or reopening. This will save you from wasted journeys to school. Turning on Dojo notifications may help you keep up to date.

After School Club

Based upon bookings made so far, **our after school club will run on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays** until further notice. Should you need to use this, please book ahead by telephone. Telephone bookings on the day may not be possible if this facility is not open. Staff will be furloughed during sessions that are not booked.

Support for families

School is open and acting upon information provided to us via phone, email or Dojo. Please reach out to us to help should you need any support during these uncertain times. If your circumstances change, please get in touch. You may be eligible for help while school remains closed. We are here to help all families.

Track and Trace/self isolation

Attendance at school requires families following any local health protection team advice given. This includes track and trace; self isolation, bubble closure and possibly whole school closure. If you do not need to send your child to school, please keep them at home.

Information for children learning at home

Online learning for all children is published on Dojo in the class story section each Monday. The same activities will be completed at school by those children whose parents are critical workers. Resources for children to use throughout the week will be regularly added. Pupils should log in to see their portfolios (not visible through parents log ins) and send their teachers their work in this section too.

It is a national expectation that all children will complete the work set.

Please contact us if your child is ill and unable to complete tasks. We will then not chase this expected work until your child is better.

If you are struggling with IT equipment and/or connection, please get in touch with school. We do not have lots of loan equipment but we will do what we can.

Additional documents added to the school website

We have updated the Remote Learning Policy which is now on the school website. This reminds parents of the learning expectations:

Children in Reception should complete a minimum 2 hours daily learning.

Children in Years 1 and 2 should complete a minimum 3 hours daily learning.

Children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 should complete a minimum 4 hours daily learning.

Thank you to the key workers who continue to do a great job which allows us to do ours! We are grateful to all those who are taking risks with their own health on behalf of our families and community.
