SCHOOL ARRANGEMENTS

Closure of Year 6 facility

Due to the rise in key worker pupils returning to school and the need to maintain social distancing, Governors have followed DfE guidance and made the decision to close school for the education of Year 6 pupils. This closure will take place from Monday 29th June. **The last day for education for Year 6 pupils will be Friday 26th June.** All parents of Year 6 pupils have been informed via email and childcare places continue to be made available to those critical worker families who need it.
