RECEPTION ASSESSMENT FOR PARENTS

You may have heard about the reception baseline assessment (RBA), which is a national statutory assessment that will be administered to children in all reception classes in September.

We have attached some information about the assessment. Reception children completed this last year and found that the children really enjoy the 1 to 1 time with staff. We make it lots of fun and only do it when the child is showing high levels of well-being and is happy in class. The assessment takes about 20 minutes and uses little games and activities. FREE SCHOOL MEALS

With many families facing financial hardship as the cost of living increases, NYCC are doing all that they can to ensure that every family that is eligible to claim Free School Meals (FSM) for their child is benefiting from this additional help. With this in mind they have made it easier for parents to apply for a free school meal. The new application process means that all applications are now made electronically. In just a few steps parents will receive an almost instant decision on whether their application has been successful. All children are eligible for free school meals if they're in reception class; year 1; or year 2. but we still ask that you apply using this form to prevent your child's school missing out on additional funding.

FOODBANK

School is an agent for the food bank, enabling us to give vouchers for food. These are provided confidentially, please contact Mrs Wells to discuss if this may help you.



The Foodbank is located at Howe Road in Norton and provides emergency food and toiletries for individuals and families in Ryedale.

Clients are referred by local support agencies such as Ryedale District Council, Citizen's Advice, Age UK, Next Steps, housing officers, social workers, family support officers, police and other partner across the area.

A client who is referred to the foodbank brings their voucher to one of the 3 distribution centres in Norton, Pickering or Kirkbymoorside. Deliveries can be made if a client is unable to get to the centres.

The Foodbank is supported by donations from the public either financial or items which can be included in the food parcels. These items can be left in the collecting boxes in Morrisons and Lidl, the Skipton Building Society or the collecting box at Elim Ryedale Church.

The following items are most needed: breakfast cereal, soup, pasta, rice, pasta sauce, baked beans, tinned meat, tinned fish, tinned vegetables, pulses, instant mash, UHT milk, tea, coffee, sugar, tinned dessert, biscuits, squash, tolletries including tooth brushes, tooth paste, men's disposable razors, cleaning materials, such as washing up liquid, pan scrubbers, spray cleaner.
