CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

School Statement on COVID-19 - Fri 20 Mar 2020

As a school, we have been monitoring the developing situation regarding COVID-19 (Coronavirus) and the advice being given to schools by the Government and Public Health England. Schools in England will close on **Friday, March 20th 2020** until further notice.

Following Government guidance, we have carefully prepared a plan with the aim of keeping disruption to a minimum. I would like you to be aware of the following key information:

As things stand the school is now closed, (this includes our after school club). NYCC are responsible for providing education for children of key workers. This is likely to be in a small number of hub schools. Details of this have not yet been released.

Even though school is now closed, education will continue. Please see separate class boxes for this work. We will be expecting students to complete their work every day including Year 6 students who able to continue their set homework programme.
