The children have been writing letters to Ernest Shackleton, (a famous explorer) to apply for a job on his ship. They decided what kind of job they wanted to do on the ship depending on what their interests were. They had to make themselves sound perfect for the job using lots of persuasive language.

In maths we have been looking at all types of measurement such as cm, mm, km, m, ml, l, g and kg. The children are becoming very confident in converting from one to the other e.g. 1500m = 1.5km.
