NATIONAL TESTS AND CHECKS

Following two years of cancellation due to Covid, the government have decided to reintroduce statutory assessments for pupils.

Year 6

Children in year 6, at the end of key stage 2, will take national curriculum tests in English grammar, punctuation and spelling, English reading and mathematics. These tests will generally take place between 9th and 13th May 2022. The tests help measure the progress pupils have made and identify if they need additional support in certain areas.

The key stage 2 tests will be taken on set dates unless your child is absent, in which case they may be able to take them up to 5 school days afterwards.

At the end of the summer term, parents will receive test results for:

- English grammar, punctuation and spelling
- English reading
- Mathematics

As there is no test for English writing, this will be reported as a teacher assessment judgement. This is a judgement teachers will make, based on your child's work at the end of key stage 2.

Year 4

Following two years of disruption, national statutory multiplication assessments will be introduced. Children in year 4 will be checked to identify multiplication facts they know. These checks will take place online in June 2022. This check helps to encourage all children to know all tables so that their maths work is accurate, and their recollection of facts is fast. We will report your child's national check result at the end of the summer term in your child's report.

Year 2

Following two years of cancellation due to Covid, the government have decided to reintroduce statutory assessments.

Children in year 2, at the end of key stage 1, will take national curriculum tests in English reading and mathematics. These tests will take place in May 2022. The tests help measure the progress pupils have made and identify if they need additional support in a certain area.

At the end of the summer term in your child's report, parents will receive test results for:

- English reading
- Mathematics

As there is no test for English writing, this will be reported as a teacher assessment judgement. This is a judgement teachers will make, based on your child's work at the end of key stage 1.

Year 1

Following two years of disruption, there will be a reintroduction of national statutory phonics assessments.

Children in year 1, will be checked to identify sounds (phonemes) they know. These checks will take place in June 2022. This check helps identify if they need additional phonics support and in which areas. We will report your child's national check result at the end of the summer term in your child's report.

We treat these national tests and checks as part of what children do in school. Teachers make sure that all children are prepared and that there is never a need to worry. We always aim to make each lesson and task a positive learning experience.

There is nothing special you will need to do to support your child with these assessments. Please continue to follow the general advice your child's teacher will have given throughout the year, including the opportunities to talk at parent'/carers' evenings.

READING AT HOME – Badger Wood, Keeper Wood

Children will now take home two physical books a week.

- A self-chosen Library book
- Read to your child:
- It is very important to encourage a love of books by reading the book your child has chosen from the school Library.
- Share a book with your child:
- O The non-decodable 'Reading for Pleasure' book is for you to read together.
- Use lots of voices, use expression, talk about the pictures and predict what might happen next. Help them learn new words and discuss the book. Ask them lots of questions.
- A fully decodable reading book with only sounds and words that they have been taught to read.
- Children will read books in a progressive sequence until they can decode unfamiliar words confidently.
- •At the beginning they may be allocated a book with no words. Encourage telling stories through pictures.
- Encourage your child to use their phonic knowledge and blending skills.
- Help them spot tricky words.
- Reread the books to develop fluency:
- o Decodable books will be changed once a week. This is to ensure that 'depth' is achieved with each book. It is important to remember that these are practice books and should be read 'to fluency'. (This means your child should be able to read it without needing to sound out the words and with natural progression of the text.
- O If your child can read the book fluently, each book has more information about how you can read for meaning with the text.
- Talk about the book afterwards.
- Reading Records
- Please keep filling in the Reading record at least three times a week to let us know the books have been read and any positive comments or concerns.
