

VIOLIN LESSONS

Dear Parents

I do hope that your children enjoyed seeing and hearing the violin music in assembly today. There is now the opportunity to learn the violin at West Heslerton CE Primary School with me. I am a qualified primary teacher with 14 years of teaching experience, and a lifelong violinist with a passion for spreading the love of playing music.

Learning a string instrument is hard work at times, but it brings many benefits, including improvements in memory, attention span and language processing, all of which supports their other learning in school. Children also learn to be patient and disciplined with their practice, building positive habits and seeing the rewards of their efforts. Above all, playing the violin should be a fun, rewarding activity with opportunities for making music with friends as well as individually.

Children will need a lot of support in the early stages of learning the violin, in a similar way to learning to read. They will need you to make time for a short daily practice and to help them with this. No expert knowledge is needed, as I will write in each child's practice book as well as sending short videos showing exactly how you can help. They will need less support once they reach a certain level of competency, but it is essential in the beginning to help children feel positive and motivated. The more they put in, the more they get out!

Lessons are £20 per individual 30 minute session, and children will need their own violin – I can advise about sourcing these and finding the correct sizes. Children of all ages can play and there is no 'perfect' time to start. Please send me a WhatsApp/Text/Email providing the information below, ideally by Friday 24th May, and I will be in touch.
