The more we weigh the more we pay! Extra bags are welcome - there's no limit



COVID

We have had lots of children off school poorly, many of whom seem to be experiencing Covid symptoms. Symptoms are listed here:

Please be vigilant and keep your child at home if they have a high temperature.

Children are able to return to school once they feel well enough and their temperature is normal.

Symptoms of COVID-19

COVID-19 symptoms can include:

- a high temperature or shivering (chills) a high temperature mea you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- · a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more th an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- · a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste
- shortness of breath
- · feeling tired or exhausted
- an aching body
- a headache
- · a sore throat
- · a blocked or runny nose
- loss of appetite
- diarrhoea
- · feeling sick or being sick

The symptoms are very similar to symptoms of other illnesses, such a colds and flu.

What to do if you have symptoms of COVID-19

You may be able to look after yourself at home if you have COVID-1 or symptoms of COVID-19.

Try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people if you or your child have symptoms and either:

- · have a high temperature
- do not feel well enough to go to work, school, childcare, or do your normal activities

You can go back to your normal activities when you feel better or de not have a high temperature.

If your child has mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat or mild cough, and they feel well enough, they can go to school or childcare.

RELATIONSHIPS AND SEX EDUCATION IN SCHOOL

Since September 2020 primary schools have been <u>legally</u> required to teach "Relationships Education".

The Family Planning Association (FPA) know that teaching Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) is a big responsibility and so have developed "Growing up with Yasmine and Tom" to cover positive relations with friends, families and other adults and children, respecting people who are sometimes different from your own family and development of skills to stay safe on and offline. This is different materials to those we use in school, although it covers the same content. This may be useful information to access at home if these subjects arise.
