RETURN TO SCHOOL JULY UPDATE

SCHOOL ARRIVAL

Children will be able to arrive at school between 8.30am and 8.45am. Children in years 1 to 6 should be dropped off in the village or at the school gate and wait on the playground in their class bubbles, a member of staff will be on duty. Badger Wood staff will meet reception parents and children in the playground to take the children to their classroom.

END OF DAY

Children in years 3 – 6 (Keeper Wood and Farthing Wood), not on school transport, will leave school at 3.25pm and walk to the place that parents have agreed to meet them in the village. They will be reminded to socially distance during this walk. A permission to leave school form is enclosed for pupils new to year 3 and those who have not completed one previously. Please return this to school by the end of term.

Badger Wood children will wait in the playground at 3.30pm for collection by parents. Only one parent per family should attend and social distancing must be maintained.

CLASS GROUPS

We have created class bubbles and reorganised classrooms to help keep everyone safe.

Children in years 5 and 6 will be taught in Farthing Wood by Mrs Bickerton and Mrs Wardell. Pupils and staff will be dedicated to this group and not mix with other groups in school.

Children in years 3 and 4 will be taught in Keeper Wood by Miss Shackley and Mrs Triffitt. Pupils and staff will be dedicated to this group and not mix with other groups in school.

Children in pre-reception, reception, year 1 and year 2 will be taught in Badger Wood by Mrs Woodward, Miss Johnson and Mrs Taylor-Barber. Pupils and staff will be dedicated to this group and not mix with other groups in school.

Whole school assemblies will not take place.
Worship will be in class, without singing.

WHAT TO BRING

Children should bring their Forest School kit to school, including wellies as we will try to make the most of the outside space. These will be kept in school as will be used most days.

All children should have a named water bottle that they will use during the day, including lunch times. Children should bring book bags if they have them. Reception children will be given a school book bag. Children in Keeper Wood and Farthing Wood will be issued with a homework bag. This is so that children may take home their reading books. All children should bring a coat which will be kept on the back of their chair.

A P.E. kit will not be needed in school initially. Please leave everything else at home. This is to stop the spread of germs.

BREAK TIMES

Break times will be spent on the field or in classrooms if wet. All children will need wellies and coats to access their class area on the field to encourage social distancing.

Play equipment is not being used.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUB

This club will run from Tuesday, September 8th. Bubbles will be maintained during activities. Staff will sign out the children to minimise contact at the end of the session

PACK UPS

Pupils who prefer to bring their own pack up will eat with their class.

Fridge storage will not be available due to the risks of sharing, therefore pack ups will be stored in the classrooms to maintain the class bubbles.

SNACKS AND DRINKS

No snacks will be available at break time. Please send all children with a fruit snack and a named water bottle until we hear more.

We are hoping Cool Milk will resume their deliveries as soon as possible to children aged under 5 and those who have paid for milk.

CORONA SYMPTOMS

Pupils, staff and other adults should not come into school if they have coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms, or have tested positive in the last 7 days. Anyone developing these symptoms during the school day will be isolated and sent home, staff will wear PPE to support children in isolation.

Families and staff will be advised to follow the guidance including self-isolation for at least 7 days and arrange to have a test. Other members of their household should self-isolate for 14 days. Staff members and parents/carers need to book a test if they are displaying symptoms. All children can be tested, including children under 5, using a home testing kit

Details of anyone they have been in close contact with should be provided to NHS Test & Trace if they were to test positive. Parents and staff are asked to inform the school immediately of the results of a test.

FACE COVERINGS

Pupils and staff are not required to wear face coverings. Those who choose to use them are required to remove face coverings on arrival at school.

Pupils under the age of 11 are not required to wear a face mask on school transport.

Pupils that arrive wearing a face covering must remove it, must wash their hands immediately on arrival (as is the case for all pupils), dispose of temporary face coverings in a covered bin or place reusable face coverings in a plastic bag they can take home with them, and then wash their hands again before heading to their classroom.

SCHOOL MEALS

Cooked meals will be available for all children from Tuesday 8th September. Pupils in Badger Wood will eat in the school hall from 11.50am. Food will be plated up and served by school staff.

Pupils in Keeper Wood and Farthing Wood will eat in their classrooms at 12 noon. Food will be plated up and served by school staff.

SCHOOL CLOSURE

If we find out that we must close during term time, parents will be informed by telephone. Children will be sent home at the end of the day and work will be posted on the school website to cover the period of closure. Detailed updates will be posted on the school website.

HOME LEARNING

If we find out that we cannot open on 8th September, we will continue our home learning newsletters on the website as we have been doing this term.

TRANSPORT

Parents and pupils are encouraged to walk or cycle to their education setting where possible.

Children in Farthing Wood and Keeper Wood should be dropped off and collected in the village to walk to and from school. This will minimise contact with other families outside the school.

HYGIENE

Children will be encouraged to wash their hands on arrival in school and frequently during the day. Individual stationery items will be issued to each child. Any shared resources will be cleaned or isolated after use.

Each class will use their own toilets.

At the end of each day the school is thoroughly cleaned.
