A single sunflower has bolding popped out of the soil just a week after planting, but has sensibly kept their hat on (the husk) whilst it's still a bit chilly.



We've had some great news from Cherwell District Council. They are funding our Home Veg Pots activity to coincide with Community Garden Week. After school on Wednesday 2nd April, we invite you all to plant a little pot of veg to continue to grow at home. We probably won't get much fruit from them this year but in years to come the children will be able to enjoy picking their own fruit and enjoy eating them fresh.

On Thursday 20th March we shall be building a frog and toad abode, looking at the lifecycle of a frog and doing frog and toad related crafts.
