Identified barriers to educational achievement

Our school identified the following as barriers for some of the pupils currently in receipt of Pupil Premium:

- Knowledge and understanding of Reading, Writing and Maths strategies to accelerate learning
- Low self-esteem and confidence
- Access to extracurricular activities such as trips, music lessons and participation in clubs
- Low attendance/punctuality of some pupils
- Parental engagement

Area of spend:

3 dedicated phase PP TAs x 5 days a week for focused interventions for pupils at risk

TA support in/out of class for focused interventions (one to one tuition) for pupils at risk -£53,854.66

Area of spend:School Library - **£4,040**

The children continue to have access to a broad and balanced selection of books. The school library and reading corners are updated termly. Pupils are reading more regularly in school and at home. There is an improved culture of reading, which is evident and the children are more enthusiastic. Reading outcomes are improving.

Area of spend:Sports/Games TA - **£2,000**

The school sports assistant planned and delivered sessions to children with a focus on Pupil Premium throughout the day during break times, lunch times and after school. All pupils were eager to engage and the school was awarded the School Games Platinum Mark for the fifth year running. Behaviour issues continue to be reduced and the children are gaining self-confidence. Self-esteem was raised and there was increased engagement. Pupils are happier and healthier.

Area of spend:

Funding for Local Authority Attendance Officer - £ 1,500

There are no attendance figures for 2019-2020 due to school closure

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Further engagement and strategies with the Local Authority Attendance Officer are planned to continue to improve attendance and narrow the gap. Enhanced support will be needed to work with families who feel anxious with the reopening of schools.

Area of spend:Funding for school trips, and residential trips - **£438.84**

All children were supported for school trips and residential trips over the year before the school was closed. Pupils were able to participate fully in school trips and residential trips.

Area of spend:Funding for extra-curricular music lessons/clubs - **£1,007.50**

Social skills were developed through participation in a range of clubs provided by the school or external providers before the school closed. Pupils enjoyed the experience of being at school and were keen to come before/stay later to participate in chosen activities. Talent, skills and efforts in non-academic subjects were celebrated and self-confidence has been developed.

Area of spend:

Funding for School to Parent Text Service - **£1,000**

The texting service was used to remind parents of events and to focus on learning to be practised at home. The service was also used to deliver updates to PA pupils on attendance. There was improved parental engagement in partnership for learning. This became even more important when the school closed during lockdown.

Area of spend:

Learning Resources - **£459**

Learning and teaching opportunities were enriched through the purchase of a laptop for a child to access activities at home for online learning.

Issues arising from this review and school closure:

- Pupil Premium children will need continued additional provision to ensure gaps close rapidly due to school closure. One to one tuition in Reading/Writing/Maths provided by the Pupil Premium TAs will be essential for catch up.
- Mental health, social skills, self-esteem and behaviour will need continued additional support after the school closure.
- The attendance and punctuality of identified Pupil Premium children will need to be closely monitored again in the coming academic year due to impact of the school closure.
