September	Appreciation	Noun 1 recognition of the value or significance of something. 2 gratitude. 3 a favourable written assessment of a person or their work. 4 increase in monetary value.
October	Co-operation	Verb 1 work jointly towards the same end. 2 comply with a request.
November	Freedom	Noun 1 the power or right to act, speak, or think freely. 2 the state of being free. 3 (freedom from) exemption or immunity from. 4 unrestricted use of something: the dog had the freedom of the house. 5 a special privilege or right of access.
December	Happiness	Adjective (happier/happiest) 1 feeling or showing pleasure or contentment. 2 willing to do something.
January	Hope	Noun 1 a feeling of expectation and desire for something to happen. 2 a person or thing that gives cause for hope. Verb 1 expect and want something to happen. 2 intend if possible to do something.
February	Love/ Passion	Noun 1 an intense feeling of deep affection. 2 a deep romantic attachment to someone. 3 a great interest and pleasure in something. 4 a person or thing that one loves. 5 (in tennis, squash, etc.) a score of zero, apparently from the phrase <i>play for love</i> (i.e. the love of the game, not the money).
March	Peace	Noun 1 freedom from disturbance; tranquillity. 2 freedom from or the ending of war. 3 (the peace) Christian Church: an action such as a handshake, signifying unity, performed during the Eucharist. - Phrases at peace 1 free from anxiety or distress.
April	Respect	Noun 1 a feeling of admiration for someone because of their qualities or achievements. 2 due regard for the feelings or rights of others. 3 (respects) polite greetings. 4 a particular aspect, point or detail.
May	Simplicity	Noun the quality or condition of being simple.
June	Tolerance	Noun 1 the ability, willingness, or capacity to tolerate something. 2 an allowable amount of variation of a specified quantity, especially in the dimensions of a machine or part.
July	Understanding	Verb (past and past part. understood) 1 perceive the intended meaning of (words, a language, or a speaker). 2 perceive the significance, explanation, or cause of. 3 interpret or view in a particular way. 4 infer from information received. 5 assume that (something) is present or is the case.
