MATHS

Our first half term will be spent reviewing and extending the children's prior knowledge, and understanding of Place Value and Addition and Subtraction. The mental work throughout will remain on number bonds — for those children not yet secure in this— and the recall of multiplication and division facts for the 2s,5 s and 10 times tables. For those who are secure on these, we will move onto 3's, 4's and 8's in that order.

Linking to Science work we will be painting pet rocks and we will be making a mural to link with our English work too.

Geography

We will be asking the question 'What makes the British landscape as it is?' To answer this question we will be beginning to understand the geographical similarities and differences through the study of human and physical geography of a region in the UK.

During this topic we will looking at the book 'The Pebble in my Pocket' and linking this to our Science curriculum.

COMPUTING/SAFE COMPUTING

In ICT the children will be learning about computer networks and how these enable communication between computers. To learn how to log on to a computer and access different information via a search engine.
