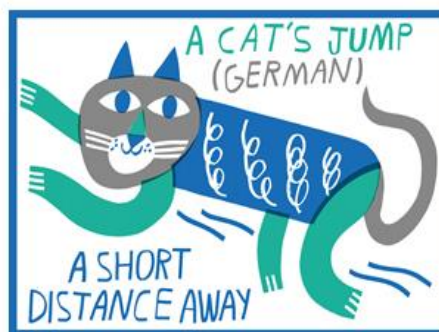


## Welcome to West Hill Languages Department.

Idioms are phrases that we use containing words, which together have no meaning. An example of this would be 'it's raining cats and dogs'. Other languages have idioms like this too.

**Idiom examples :**

Once bitten twice shy

**Ein gebranntes Kind scheut das Feuer. (German)**

*A burned child shuns the fire.*

To wear rose tinted spectacles

**Tomaten auf die Augen haben**

*To have tomatoes on the eyes.*

To beat around the bush

**Irse por la ramas. (Spanish)**

*Going along the branches*

A bad workman blames his tools

**El mal escribano le echa la culpa a la pluma. (Spanish)**

*The poor writer blames the pen.*
