CURRICULUM POLICY

The Westleigh School aims to develop the best in every student through the excellent teaching of a broad and balanced curriculum. Our aim is to provide an environment for learning that is safe, supportive, caring and encourages life-long learning.

The curriculum at the Westleigh School follows the statutory requirements of the national curriculum, but also provides wide ranging courses to meet students' needs.

The school aims to ensure that each student's needs are fully met and that barriers to learning are removed so that each pupil can access the curriculum and reach his/her full potential.

We subscribe fully to the principles that every child matters and this underpins our curriculum:-

We aim to ensure that all our students:-

- 1. <u>Remain healthy</u> by promoting a healthy lifestyle.
- 2. <u>Stay safe</u> by providing students with learning in a safe and secure environment; ensuring they learn how to keep themselves safe and understand how to access support to safeguard themselves.
- 3. <u>Enjoy school and achieve the highest standards</u>– by providing opportunities for students to learn by developing essential skills and using their creative talents which will serve them throughout their lives.
- 4. <u>Make a positive contribution</u> to school and the wider community and understand the importance of citizenship and their place in contributing meaningfully to society.
- 5. <u>Achieve economic well-being in the future</u>—through high standards of teaching and learning, promoting student engagement with education to ensure short and long term economic welfare and opportunities.
