Dear Parents / Carers.

Re: Proposal to change the school working pattern to include a 2-week autumn half term holiday

We are proposing to move to a 2-week autumn break, and we would like parental feedback on the proposed changes.

If approved, there would be a 2-week holiday in October / November rather than 1 week as per the current pattern. The changes necessary to facilitate this have been outlined in the table below for 2020-2021 (all other dates remain the same). Please rest assured that students will be in school for the same total number of days per academic year:

The advantages of these changes would be a shorter summer holiday therefore less educational slippage for students and a longer break during the longest school term of the year. This will also give families the option to go on holiday during a relatively cheaper week of the year, thereby reducing the amount of requests for term time holidays or instances of unauthorised holidays which result in valuable learning being missed.
