In addition, if you have any concerns about helping your child learn or you need any other support from the school, please let us know. We miss having the students in school, but we must continue to follow the government's guidance to keep everyone in our community safe. So, it's necessary to carry on with learning remotely and will keep our website updated as much as possible. At the moment, we have uploaded 100s of smaller activities for your children to do, each worth 10, 20 or 30 points. The idea is for children to select activities of their choice and aim to complete at least 100 points every day – don't break the learning chain.
