

## ART:

Rec - Look at the Van Gogh images on the attached page. Can you create your own Van Gogh image or model using any resources or materials within your home?

Y1+2- Use the attached sheet to help you and draw a cubism portrait. Talk about how Picasso's paintings are different to normal drawings.

Y3+4 - Create a colourful piece of artwork using just straight lines to create triangles. Look at Kandinsky's work for inspiration.

Y5+6 -Have you heard of the pop artist, Roy Lichtenstein? Create an artwork in his style. Check the sheet for ideas.

## WRITING:

Rec - Write a sentence about your favourite piece of art in the pictures. What do you like about it? Why is it your favourite?

Y1+2 - Pretend you are an art critic (someone who reviews pieces of art) Write what you like/dislike about one of his paintings and why, along with some information about the painting.

Y3+4 - Write a set of instructions on how you intend to make your mask. Edit your instructions once you've made your mask. (See DT box).

Y5+6 - You're on a school trip to an art gallery when you and your friend become separated from the rest of the class. As you look around for them, a voice asks if you are ok. The problem is, the voice comes from a portrait! Write a story about what happens next.

## GEOGRAPHY:

Rec - Using the attached sheet explore art from different countries and answer the questions.

Y1+2 - Using the attached sheet explore art from different countries and answer the questions.

Y3+4 - Create a list of adjectives (describing words) and countries that begin with the same letter. Create a poem to describe your chosen countries. Eg. fantastic France, exquisite England, sunny Sri Lanka.

Y5+6- Create a crossword puzzle about places you've been to for a family member to complete. Write clues for your puzzle.

## MUSIC:

Can you create a drawing to music? Try and reflect the song or tune in your drawing.

Listen to the National Anthems (instrumental versions) of the UK, France, Russia and USA. Say what you like or don't like about the music.

## MATHS:

Rec - Using the attached worksheets or objects in your home, try to make a symmetrical picture or a repeated pattern.

Y1+2 - Using objects in your home create a symmetrical pattern.

Y3+4 - Can you remember different types of angles? Look at the back and remind yourself. Now look at the pictures, how many triangles can you see? How many right angles, obtuse and acute angles can you see?

Y5+6 - Investigate the area of different rectangles. You could measure cereal boxes, magazines, games boxes. Find rectangles. Measure them, then work out the area. What has the largest area? What has the smallest area? Try working out the perimeter of each shape.

HISTORY: Use the pictures on the other page to help you.

Rec and Y1+2- Look at Van Gogh's painting, A Bedroom in Arles. Can you create a design of your bedroom? The painting is from a long time ago. How is your bedroom different/ the same?

KS2 - In the painting 'Children's Games' by Pieter Bruegel, which was painted in 1560, you can see children playing lots of games. Look at part of the painting on the additional sheet. Which games and toys do you recognise? Create your own playground picture with children playing with games and toys we have now.

## DT

Rec.- Using recycled materials can you create your own Starry Night?

Y1+2 - Create a recycled art face using junk modelling in your home.

KS2 - Design a traditional African mask. Look at the pictures for inspiration. Use recycled materials. Plan, design, make and evaluate your mask.
