He said: "It is now safeguarded by a high fence and ready for all the youngsters to explore nature, play small group games and enjoy

quiet-times sat around the trees during break and lunch times. As part of the project, Westminster Primary and FCAT has agreed to oversee and maintain the whole elevated area of the park near the school taking responsibility for the regular grass cutting and tree pruning.
