

PLANNED P.E. AND SPORTS GRANT SPENDING 2020/21

What is P.E. and Sports Grant Funding?

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

DfE Funding for 2020/21 financial year= £19,000

Evaluation of spending during the academic year 2019-2020

- PE coordinator worked with sports coaches from Blackpool Football Club to develop the current curriculum and incorporate a more holistic approach to PE. The curriculum model was then successfully implemented across the school by a team teach approach. Staff feel more confident to deliver high quality PE lessons that incorporate both the physical skill and those including teamwork, communication and decision making. Blackpool Football Club have also provided children with a variety of activities to improve their physical fitness and promote active lifestyles; both at lunch time and after school.
- Children engaged in high quality PE lessons provided by Evolution sport. A variety of physical activities were taught to the children and they could continue the skills learnt in lunch time and after school clubs.
- Providing PE kits for the new Reception children allows equal opportunity for all children to start off their physical education journey. Purchasing replacement kits higher up school also ensures every child at Westminster is able to take part in high quality PE lessons.
- The purchase of new sports equipment has ensured that children have access to appropriate resources for each lesson. It allows teachers to plan for and deliver a variety of physical activities including; gymnastics, dance, games and athletics.
- Bikeability has allowed many of our students to gain confidence in the ability to ride a bike and gained important road safety skills. The balance bike scheme also introduced our younger children to bike safety and the basic skills of riding a bike that can be continued through bikeability in key stage 2.
- Unfortunately some of our planned activities could not go ahead due to Covid-19 including; the girls and boys football events, inter school competitions and outdoor adventurous activities that were planned for later in the school year. Whilst these events could not take place we used remaining sport premium to create a new trim trail in the school playground. This is a huge benefit to all of the children at Westminster as it develops a wide variety of skills. It can be used as part of outdoor play, encouraging physical fitness and strength, but it can also be incorporated into PE planning for outdoor and adventurous activities.
- We also invested in Healthy Heads who have worked alongside teachers to deliver a holistic approach to PE. Teaching the children about teamwork, resilience and respect.
