

PLANNED P.E. AND SPORTS GRANT SPENDING 2022/23

What is P.E. and Sports Grant Funding?

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

DfE Funding for 2020/21 financial year= £19,000

Evaluation of spending during the academic year 2021-2022

- Children from Y1-6 had a water safety talk from Blackpool Beach Patrol with a Q and A session. This allowed them to see the dangers of the tides, the sea and playing on the beach. This is vital information as we live so close to the promenade and some of our children access the beach unsupervised.
- Children engaged in high quality after school and lunchtime sports club provided by Evolution sport. A variety of physical activities were taught to the children to embed their learning from lessons and encourage a love of physical activity and sports.
- Providing PE kits for the new Reception children allows equal opportunity for all children to start off their physical education journey. Purchasing replacement kits higher up school also ensures every child at Westminster is able to take part in high quality PE lessons.
- The purchase of new sports equipment has ensured that children have access to appropriate resources for each lesson. It allows teachers to plan for and deliver a variety of physical activities including; gymnastics, dance, games and athletics.
- Bikeability has allowed many of our students to gain confidence in the ability to ride a bike and gained important road safety skills. The balance bike scheme also introduced our younger children to bike safety and the basic skills of riding a bike that can be continued through bikeability in key stage 2.
- Getting outdoors and particularly out of Blackpool for Outdoor and Adventurous activities is vital at Westminster due to the level of deprivation and disadvantage our children and families face. Many of our children do not experience life beyond their neighbourhood and are inexperienced in the world around them. Opportunities to walk in nature environments and take part in team building, orienteering and other outdoor pursuits have been provided.
- We also continue to invest in Healthy Heads who worked alongside teachers to deliver a holistic approach to PE. Teaching the children about teamwork, resilience and respect.
- Transport is a key factor to lots of experiences and coach travel is often a necessity.
- Due to missed opportunities to access school swimming during the Covid pandemic Y6 had extra sessions which allowed them to gain more confidence, improve their stroke and allow vital practical water safety sessions.
